PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



elcome to the 2025 SA Merino Annual Directory, your comprehensive guide for all South Australian studs including field days and expos. This directory provides details and essential information for the year ahead. Enjoy exploring and connecting with the Merino community! 2024 has been one of the most challenging years in decades for South Australian sheep producers, with record low rainfall over large areas of the state and severe frosts in September causing havoc. A heavy downpour from thunderstorms in mid-October was the biggest rain event for many regions. While it did benefit some late crops, it was generally too late for most areas. It did, however, generate a fresh green pick for others and will provide some relief, in terms of feed. The importance of a dual-purpose Merino enterprise was certainly evident this year, with farmers taking advantage of failed crops and grazing them to provide extra cashflow in a tight year.

Most on-property sales met or exceeded vendor expectations for both clearance and

average. Pastoral orders put a solid floor in sales as they were able to operate on better rams in the catalogue. Most sales achieved averages in the \$1,500 to \$2,200 range, which was a pretty good result considering the tough seasonal conditions.

The Adelaide Ram Sale achieved a solid result, averaging \$7,364. Congratulations to first-time vendor Sharlu Park who achieved the top price of \$23,000

The School Merino Wether Competition held at the Royal Adelaide Show continues to grow each year and a huge crowd was in attendance this year. Congratulations to David Rowett and his committee for such a well-run and successful event.

The Elders SA Stud Merino Expo at Burra will be the first of the Merino field day events which showcase the best of South Australian genetics. There will be on-property displays on Wednesday 12 March and an AWI sponsored dinner along with a Fashion Parade that evening. A centralised display at the Burra

DESIGNING THE FUTURE OF FASHION

Merino wool fashion parade at last year's Royal Adelaide Show was the perfect platform to showcase the creative talents of TAFE SA's fashion design students.

As part of the event, emerging designers are tasked with presenting innovative, sustainable designs incorporating donated dead stock Merino wool fabric. The Merino SA Fashion Design Award was then presented to the student with the most creative and sustainable design.

Advanced Diploma in Applied Fashion Design and Merchandising student Aida Karabi won last year's award for her 'Twisted Elegance Wool Collection', taking home a cash prize.

"The parade was an incredible opportunity to explore the potential of Merino wool," Aida said.

"It allowed me to push the boundaries of design while staying true to the principles of sustainability. My collection blends wearable art with practicality, using wool to create something both beautiful and environmentallyconscious."

Aida designed a cropped grey wool jacket, intricately hand-embroidered with Boteh Jegheh patterns, a traditional Persian motif, on the front and back. This was paired with a red wrap skirt. Red piping and a matching red lining inside the jacket added another layer of detail, while a French-style hat completed the collection.

"The jacket's intricate design and the red accents were meant to make a statement.

sustainability of Merino wool as a fibre.



New ownership for Baderloo and Glenlea Park

Two prominent South Australian studs, Baderloo and Glenlea Park, have recently welcomed new owners, who are both familiar faces in the industry. Learn more about them and their plans for the studs.

Alison Henderson – Baderloo Poll Merino Stud

Tell me a bit about yourself and your background in the industry.

I'm a fifth generation farmer, and this is my ninth year back on the farm. I started my own stud, Hendowie Poll Merinos, in the back half of 2021.

What do you love about South Australia's Merino industry?

I love being involved in the constant innovation, trying to breed productive sheep. Conditions vary greatly in SA which mean we have to be at the forefront of innovation, to help us adapt. We can breed a sheep here in the Mid North that could go to a completely different area, and perform well, so I think that is pretty exciting.

What encouraged you to acquire Baderloo Poll Merinos?

I was looking to expand the stud enterprise in our farming system, and buying Baderloo was a way to be able to do that quickly, by purchasing those genetics rather than waiting for the slow build up with Hendowie. The two sheep types are reasonably similar, and both are a very good base from which to build.

What will change as a result of the new ownership?

The sheep have moved up the road to Caltowie, at our farm, and that is where we will hold our on-property auction this year. The timing of the auction will also shift to the end of August.

In terms of the sheep themselves, there won't be any drastic changes, but I will be constantly working to improve all the profit-driving traits while maintaining good balance.

Joe Murdoch – Glenlea Park Merino and Poll Merino Stud

How long has your family been involved with Merinos?

My great-grandfather first got into Merino sheep in 1936 and then formed the Orrie Cowie stud in the 1960s. In 1985 my father formed North Cowie when the farm was split up. Ever since, our family has held an annual ram sale at North Cowie on the Yorke Peninsula.

Why did you decide to purchase Glenlea Park?

I have always been a big supporter of Peter Wallis and Glenlea Park sheep; we have bought six or seven sires over the last decade from Glenlea Park and it is a stud we really believe in. The farming focus on the Yorke Peninsula has shifted to more continuous cropping in recent years, and so when Glenlea Park came up for sale, the opportunity was too good not to explore.

What will change as a result of the new ownership?

We have purchased a property in the South East and the Glenlea Park on-property sale will continue to be held in the South East. All breeding ewes, both North Cowie and Glenlea Park, will be located in the South East, but we will also continue to hold a North Cowie sale on the Yorke Peninsula

What is next for Glenlea Park?

My goals are pretty simple, to enhance the Glenlea Park stud while also continuing to grow North Cowie.

In the next three to four years, I hope to be expanding our operations and selling around 250 rams at auction; that would be a key goal. The other is to be selling sheep into every state in Australia.

ELDERS INVESTS IN AUTOMATED WOOL HANDLING FACILITI

Iders' commitment to the Australian wool industry has only grown since the Elder family first began buying, financing and handling wool in the mid-1800s. Now handling more than 350,000 bales of wool each year, Elders continues to adapt and innovate in a changing wool industry by establishing a worldfirst automated wool handling business, Elders Wool.

Elders has invested \$25 million in the new wool handling business, the largest single investment in wool handling this century, signifying a long-term commitment to the Australian wool industry. The wool handling operation is based around two centralised hubs, in Melbourne and Perth, supported by an extensive network of receival centres. The Melbourne facility, which officially opened in August 2024, accommodates bales stacked 10 high in its 35,000 square metre warehouse. The bales are moved using a fleet of 22 electric-powered autonomous guided vehicles (AGVs), which are a world first for the wool industry, while automated, custom-built core lines process wool.

The AGVs are self-driving, laser-guided vehicles that can operate 24 hours a day before recharging for 90 minutes. Powered by on-roof solar, the AGVs use significantly less energy than human-driven forklifts and provide significant long-term operational and safety benefits.

The Perth facility, which opened in July 2023, combines wool sales activities with storage

and handling operations, aiming to improve efficiency in the wool supply chain.

Elders Managing Director and CEO Mark Allison says that the new business is an investment in the future of Australian wool and will revolutionise wool handling.

"Elders is committed to providing exceptional customer service and contributing to the future success of our growers and the wool industry. We are demonstrating this commitment by continual investment in supply chain optimisation, including the logistics, sampling, sales and storage of wool through automated warehouse operations," Mr Allison said.

"Elders recognises that the landscape of the Australian wool industry has changed dramatically in the last three decades and it is critical to adapt and change for Australian fibre to remain some of the best in the world.

"To this end, in making the largest single supply chain investment in the Australian wool industry this century, we stand with our customers to deliver the best sustainable wool supply globally.

"The long-term sustainability of the wool industry and improved outcomes for our clients is our key priority."







MERINO CORE TO SOUTH EAST LIVELIHOOD

Elders Wool District Manager Steph Brooker-Jones pictured with Janelle and Nick Edwards, commented that The Washpool wool was 'Artic' white, which in her ratings of white shades was brighter that 'Alaskan' or 'Antarctic' white.

ick and Janelle Edwards are passionate wool growers and Merinos are at the core of their South East three-tiered sheep enterprise. Janelle, nee Hocking, is a fifth generation Hocking family member to work 'The Washpool' at Avenue Range, between Lucindale and Kingston SE. Her father, Rex Hocking, explained that his great grandfather worked on the railways in the 1880s and purchased 20 acres to start the family's accumulation.

The Washpool is on shallow black flats over limestone country with an average 575mm rainfall. Their 1800 self-replacing Merino ewe flock is the core to producing their own Border Leicester/Merino ewes that in turn breed their Poll Dorset and White Suffolk cross prime lambs.

Janelle said that the love of wool - the natural fibre - has driven the family to recover from the devastating 2021 bush fires where they lost 500 sheep and 50% of their ground and fodder reserves. The land has made a remarkable recovery with natural scrub and wild flowers returning to bloom.

With a focus on finer fibre, their Novembershorn ewes average 17 micron, with hoggets 15 to 16 micron. Concentrating on breeding pure white wool 'high-rainfall' type sheep that yield 72 to 73%, they have no issue with fleece discolour. On my visit I saw their first cross ewes that after the very tough season were a solid medium frame sheep in good nick.

They produce their own oaten hay and lucerne silage and buy in barley and beans to feed a spread lambing, with lambs not sold in the





spring but held over to finish in the summer and autumn months.

With the support of her parents Rex and Kay Hocking, Janelle said that she and her husband Nick were focussed on improving their sheep streams and the performance of their Merino core flock

industry and improved outcomes for our clients is our key priority."



Rex Hocking, Washpool Kelpies, started breeding dogs in 1985 after a successful period as a horse trainer of trotters and pacers in the 1970s and having trained a Miracle Mile winner. Rex, with support of wife Kay, has sold dogs and presented in clinics not only across Australia, but worldwide. Also a keen yard dog competitor, he is a former Australian Yard Dog Champion. The Hockings are avid SA Yard Dog Association supporters and Rex is heartened by the youthful enthusiasm of the group.

SCHOOL MERINO W COMPETITION

he School Merino Wether competition was an excellent success again this year with record entries for the 2024 event. There were 229 wethers from 40 schools, with 76 teams entered.

The schools source the wethers in early March and they are then shorn and looked after right through until September. During this time the students get an opportunity to learn many facets of the sheep industry starting with the shearing, nutrition, handling and side sampling. Then, once at the Show, they learn the commercially relevant parts of a commercial sheep operation, with weight gain recorded from March to September, a muscle/fat scan is completed, and fleece weight, micron and yield results noted.

The wethers arrived at the Show on the Tuesday afternoon and Rachel Chirgwin weighed all the animals and muscle and fat scanned them. The wethers also have their teeth checked pre-weighing to see if they are lambs or hoggets. This was an important process as those deemed hoggets had a significant drop in price/kg of estimated



carcass weight, with Thomas Foods International's current grid price used.

On the Wednesday morning judging was kicked off by Luke Schreiber, judging the Spence Dix & Co Best Pen of 3 Wethers.

Luke, with Bill Baade's help, was looking for uniformity of the 3, neat pocket crutch and structural soundness. Luke commented this year was the most even competition he has ever judged which is a credit to the schools.

Shearing of the wethers closely followed on in the morning and whilst that was happening Anthony Hurst and Cody Jones were judging the Rabobank Handlers Competition. Once again this was a challenge to judge with so many well presented students who had a very good technique for holding the wethers.

The shearing part of the competition is coordinated by Glenn Haynes who also did a great job on the microphone during the day explaining to those watching all facets of the shearing industry and he is a wealth of information. Once shorn each individual fleece is weighed and assessed which was coordinated by Jarred Phillips and Rob Williams from AWN, we thank them for their continued support.

In 2024, stud ewes had 119% lambing, showing areat fertility despite the demanding season. The 10-year average for stud ewes is 18.9 micron and ewe hoggets is 17 micron.

At the 63rd on-property sale, 168 rams sold with the main auction averaging \$2066, topping at \$8,400 purchased by Alma Merinos in NSW.

Glenville's 64th on-property sale will be held on Tuesday 5 August at 1.30pm. 180 Polls will be offered with ASBVs, current micron tests, body and fleece weight rankings and raw carcass scans. A further 150 rams will be available for private selection.

Also, sons of Leahcim 222629, Richmond 220260, Mernowie 221007 and Mumblebone 210084 and Kiandra 210500 sit in the top end of growth and or carcass indexes while maintaining a low micron.





REIMAGINING WOOL PRODUCTION ON **KANGAROO ISLAND**

estled in the rugged landscape of Kangaroo Island, a group of local farmers has reimagined the production of woollen garments, focusing on sustainability, craftsmanship, and community.

Founded by 23 local farming families in 2012, wool processor and fashion label Kangaroo Island Wool has quickly become a leading example of ethical and sustainable fashion.

General Manager Sophie Clarke said the operations of the business start with the fleeces of local sheep and end with elegant, environmentally-friendly garments.

"Our farms are located within a 40-kilometre radius of our facility. With sustainability at the heart of what we do, we're excited to be working towards reducing our reliance on external supply chains, minimising fossil fuel use, and lowering the environmental impact of our fibre. All the wool processed to yarn onsite is sourced locally from our farmers," said Sophie.

"We scour and card the wool before spinning it into yarn, which is then used to create a stunning range of products, including wraps, ponchos, scarves, and quilts."

One of Kangaroo Island Wool's standout products is their felted wool hats, which combine craftsmanship with practicality.

"Our new felted hats are hand-stitched and hand-rolled, and each hat takes about five hours of work from an artisan," said Sophie. "They're made from 100% super fine Merino wool, currently with traceability and provenance to our closest farmer, about 2 kilometres away. They are bespoke, each one individually customised and tailored, and totally unique, they are 100% wool with no fur which makes them truly sustainable and an exciting product to include in our range."

At the heart of the business is its deep connection with the local farming community. The island's sheep farming industry is its largest employer, and Sophie said Kangaroo Island Wool is proud to support it by sourcing wool from local farmers who can then have more impact over the final product.

"It's rare for farmers to have any control over

their end product, whether they are growing wool or any other commodity," Sophie said."But our business allows them to see the impact of their hard work in the final piece. That's really special."Visitors to Kangaroo Island can now experience the process firsthand through

Visitors to Kangaroo Island can now experience the process firsthand through immersive tours run by Sophie and the team that showcase the entire wool production journey. The tours include a one-of-a-kind 360-degree cinema experience, where guests can learn about Kangaroo Island's dreamtime stories, its geographical history, and farming practices.

"Our aim is to educate people about where their products come from," said Sophie.



"Visitors see how wool is transformed into fashion and learn about the land and people behind it. They can also take home a piece of the island through our products."

Looking ahead, Kangaroo Island Wool is working towards becoming a fully circular business while also expanding their range of garments.

"We've only been operational in this capacity for about 12 months, so we're taking it step by step, but the long-term goal is to make our processes fully circular," Sophie explained.

"We're passionate about what we do, and we're excited to keep growing while staying true to our values. Our goal is to touch lightly on the planet, and create products people can feel good about wearing."

GREENFIELDS **KARALEE**

Greenfields Karalee was founded in 2024 after James and Fiona separated from James' family stud. Greenfields, where they have been selling up to 350 of their own line of stud Poll Merino rams since 2020. The name Greenfields Karalee pays homage to both James' and Fiona's family history, with Greenfields being in the Sullivan family since it was founded in 1949, and Karalee being founded in 1906 by the Freebairn Family and dissolved in the early 1990s.

In 2024, Greenfields Karalee sold 200 rams throughout Australia, from the southeast of South Australia through to the pastoral areas of NSW, SA and QLD. 72 rams were sold by auction at our on-property ram sale in September with the remainder being private selection.

Our ewes average between 19.5 to 20 micron and cut between 8 to 9kg of wool.

Our on-property ram sale will be held on Monday 8 September 2025 at Booborowie Station, Booborowie. Inspection starts at 9am with the sale starting at 1pm. Lunch and light refreshments will be available.

GUM HILL

Gum Hill Poll Merino Stud forms an integral part of a mixed farming multi-generational family business owned and operated by the Lines Family in SA's Mid North. Established by the family in 1885, the stud has experienced the hardships and enjoyed the prosperity of the sheep and wool industry across its 140-year history. Gum Hill became one of the first sheep studs to use objective measurement of physical production traits, including greasy fleece weight and yearling bodyweight. This measurement process began

in the 1950s, and since then the stud has taken a balanced approach, considering measured traits and visual subjective assessment in selecting the plain bodied, fertile, resilient easy care Poll Merinos that our clients' desire.

We are now a few years into the use of Estimated Breeding Values (EBVs) and using DNA Genomic testing to determine each ram's genetic merit. Understanding the genetic traits that can influence our client's flocks along with their environments has allowed us to continue and enhance our breeding of the Gum Hill type of sheep our clients and the industry desires.

We now have over 12,000 sheep genomically tested in our data set. The collection of this genetic information, in conjunction with measured data has produced enhanced Genomic Estimated Breeding Values of high accuracy and repeatability on highly inherited traits. Our partnership with the University of Adelaide's Davies Livestock Research Centre to produce these values continues to enable us to drive our genetic progress forward, tailoring breeding values and Indexes to our client's various needs. At field days in 2025 we will have preliminary Genomic estimated breeding values available for all rams displayed in March on-property and at Keith in July.

Rams are available for private selection on-property from August through to October.

GUNALLO

Gunallo Poll Merino stud is situated 8km south of the Mallee Highway between Murrayville and Pinnaroo.

Gunallo breeds uncomplicated sheep that are early maturing, fertile with long stapled, crimpy white wools on the large frame that our sheep are noted for.

Gunallo sheep have strong constitutions and are working towards a mules-free sheep with positive fat and eve muscle.

Extensive artificial insemination has been instrumental in achieving these goals as well as advice from our stud classer Bill Walker.

In 2024 Gunallo sold rams to a top price of \$11,000 to Rothsay Park Poll in Victoria. Gunallo rams and semen are currently going to most states.

2024 has been tough year for feed and for surplus ewes and lambs so it is more important to breed profitable sheep which are easy care.

We are looking to this year's young rams which are showing plenty of potential with more rams having elite, free-growing wools on large frames.

Sires used for this year's rams includes first progeny of Richmond 128 and Richmond 117, as well Gunallo 67, Gunallo 53 & Forest Springs 291. There will be more from Glenlea Park 1063, Gunallo 431, Leahcim 2477, Mernowie 1080, Gunallo 470, Gunallo 551, Mumblebone 532 plus other leading sires.

Gunallo is accredited brucellosis free and is MN3 status Sheep MAP.

In 2025, Gunallo will be displaying rams in Bendigo, Keith, Hamilton, and selling at the Classings Classic Ram Sale and Adelaide Ram Sale.

Our 46th annual on-property ram sale will be held on Thursday 28 August 2025

Current wool tests will be available on all rams to be offered as well as ASBVs from Sheep Genetics, inspections are also welcome.

HILL VIEW OP OP

Hill View was founded in 1891 by E.H. Starkey by the purchase of 100 ewes from A. Gilmour, Mount Pleasant, which were mated with rams from A.J. Murray, Mount Crawford, Williamstown,

In 2012, the stud ownership passed to Lyall Starkey who went into partnership with his daughter Kayla, trading as K.M. & L.W. Starkey. Since taking on this partnership, Lyall and Kayla have strived to breed Merinos suitable for their cold winters and 600mm+ annual rainfall, and this has resulted in breeding animals which we feel best suit our climatic conditions.

Our wool types range from fine-medium to medium wools, that are bright, pearly white, well defined in crimp and soft to the touch. We also bring carcass quality to our sheep as well, and while they may not look big at first glance, the capacity of depth in the barrel region, and length as well, gives us the opportunity to grow dual-purpose merinos, as previously said, in our climatic conditions

Hilton Heath sheep are big, plain bodied, are early maturing, very fertile and have good eye muscle. Sires in use in the Poll stud include Hilton Heath, Poll Boonoke, Orrie

Cowie and Carcuma North. In the Merino stud we are using Hilton Heath, Wanganella and Orrie Cowie. All sires have been selected for staple length, bright white wool with crimp and lustre on a plain big body.

We will be attending the South East Field Day and will also be at Bendigo and the Adelaide sheep shows.



The Kelvale Poll Merino Stud was founded in 1966 by the Kellock family and is now managed by Stephen and Peta Kellock at Keith in the South East.

Today there are currently 1000 stud ewes that are mated to Kelvale-bred sires with outside influence via AI and ET programs.

The main breeding objective of the stud is to produce a well-balanced animal for both wool and meat production. This is achieved by improving the density, length and quality of the wool grown on a highly productive animal, with high growth rates.

Kelvale are currently shearing every six months and obtaining testing

lengths in excess of 70mm however our aim is to genetically breed the length to above 80mm consistently. Deep crimping and bold, white wools are grown with an average flock micron of 19.0.

Maintaining and breeding a plain-bodied sheep has allowed for the practice of mulesing to be phased out; no lambs have been mulesed since 2008. We have also increased our lambing percentage to be consistently over 110% from ewes mated with some mobs achieving over 130% in recent years.

Kelvale is actively involved in the collection and use of data within Sheep Genetics. The ASBV data is invaluable to continually evaluate and improve wool and carcass traits, with positive fat and muscle of high importance for survivability of lambs. We participate in Sire Evaluation trials and have had great consistent genetic results.

Kelvale is a founding member of SRS® Genetics, as we are prepared to breed a highly productive sheep that will thrive anywhere in Australia. Rams are sold into Tasmania, Victoria, NSW, Queensland and all over South Australia. See our website for events where Kelvale Rams will be on display.

KIANDRA

Kiandra Poll Merino Stud is located north of Bordertown, in the Upper South East of South Australia

Early growth, good constitution, feet and fertility, on a plain bodied poll Merino, in equal combination with ASBV measurements are the core of our stud's selection process. We strive for medium to fine, long stapled, well nourished wool, with deep barrels. We have moved to nonmulesing and have completed genomic testing on the entire stud flock.

Semen sales continue to be strong, with Kiandra 200065, Kiandra 210266, Kiandra 221648 and Kiandra 220906 leading the charge. Progeny of these rams have seen top prices in stud ram auctions and reserve rams retained for studs as sires.

We offer our rams by auction and an inspection day is held the week before our ram sale. ASBVs are available on all rams sold, with many in the top 5 to 10% across indexes and individual traits.

Kiandra Poll Merinos are bred to perform in all conditions.

KURRABI PARK

Kurrabi Park Poll Merino Stud was registered in 2014 and is located at Koppio on the lower Eyre Peninsula, with an average annual rainfall of 500 millimetres.

The stud is an entirely non-mulesed flock and mulesing ceased within our commercial ewe flock in 2007. Since ceasing mulesing, we have not noticed any detrimental effects to question this decision.

Our breeding objectives include white, bright, medium wool on a structurally sound, easy care, dual-purpose frame. Our bloodline was founded on North Ashrose, and since then we have introduced genetics from Moorundie Park. Glenlea Park, Roemahkita, Leahcim, Calcookara and O'Brien Poll Merino.

We are focused on using MerinoSelect as an important sire buying tool, with the intent to head down this path in our stud, as it provides us

with objective information to assist in our breeding decisions along with physical assessment of wool and structural confirmation.



Lampata Poll Merino Stud and family business, run by Bruce, Gaylia, Robert and Courtney Pocock, was first registered in 1982.

Lampata is based at Lameroo in the southern Mallee of SA and is run in conjunction with their other farming enterprises, cropping and commercial sheep. Lampata Poll Merinos are indexed in the top 10% dual purpose index for sheep genetics flock profile.

All sheep are paddock run and mated to give full and honest assessment under commercial conditions, just as is required in commercial clients' flocks.

Lampata's emphasis is on producing affordable and highly productive, plain-bodied, fertile and genuine dual-purpose rams for the commercial producer. Excellent returns are being made by eir clients when selling wool or surplus stock.

Approximately 600 of their own surplus ewes are offered and highly sought at the annual Lameroo Off-Shears Sale, with many used to breed top lines of maternal ewes and prime lambs for our clients

Lampata runs 1625 ewes, including 730 stud

ewes. Their average flock micron is 20.5 for ewes and 19.5 for hoggets. They have stayed in this medium micron range to maximise overall productivity and profitability.

Their staple length allows for twice yearly shearings, which also gives management advantages.

They initially select 300 ram lambs each year, later reducing that to the top 150 visually, which are then widely assessed for fleece weight, micron, staple length, birth type, growth, fat and eye muscle.

All rams are ovine brucellosis accredited and OJD gudair vaccinates. We will be displaying at the South East Merino Field Day.

Lampata will sell rams at their annual on-property sale on Monday 18

August, and privately.

The Pocock family invite anyone interested to inspect their sheep; they are an 'open book' and their door is always open.

will take Leahcim and our clients to the next level of advanced profitability and ethical breeding.



ABOUT THE STUDS

Lucernbrae Stud has concentrated on breeding Merino sheep that meet the demand of producers and consumers who require the sheep industry to address future ethical issues. We concentrate on breeding dual purpose wrinkle-free, plain bodied sheep and we ceased mulesing in 2007. Our aim is to breed elite sheep with soft, stylish white wool around 18.5 micron. Current ewe hoggets carrying five months' wool were shorn and tested 17.5 micron, cutting 3kg wool. Ewe hoggets with 8 months wool have cut an average 6kg. Shearing occurs twice yearly with maidens being shorn three times in every two years. The stud is ovine brucellosis and OJD accredited MM3. ASBVs are adding to our sheep genetic data with some

MALLEETECH

Malleetech Poll Merino Stud has been breeding robust, paddock reared, fertile and heavy wool producing sheep in the heart of the Murray Mallee for over 40 years. Early in the process of setting up the stud, David Smith, the stud principal, realised the importance of recording the full parentage of the progeny to maximise the overall generational genetic gain of the animal. To achieve this, the ewes are mated to a single sire and then at lambing the progeny are matched to their dam in a time consuming but worthwhile process.

Knowing the pedigree of the animal is only half the battle however, as data must be collected on each animal to ensure the greatest genetic gain is being achieved. Malleetech have been using Australian Sheep Breeding Values (ASBVs) since 1999 to leverage the data collected on farm to accurately compare our sheep to any throughout Australia. In the SA Sire Evaluation Trials, Malleetech sires have performed very well. Fleece weights, staple

strength, eye muscle and fat depth, body weights, weaning rate and many other traits have all been used to give us the versatile and reliable producing Malleetech sheep we have today.

Rams are given no special treatment in the paddock, what you see on sale day is what you get in your paddock. This also helps to identify poor performers that may have been able to avoid detection under a more lenient management system. Malleetech sheep are bred tough to perform in Mallee conditions with minimal hand feeding and no shedding. Since 2021 no animals have been mulesed at Malleetech as they aim to breed plain, easy care and sustainable sheep.

MERNOWIE

lan Rowett founded the Mernowie Stud in 1975, and son David is now joint Stud Master. Mernowie is located at Marrabel, 100km north of Adelaide between the Clare and Barossa Valleys.

The Mernowie Stud is renowned for its ability to produce top quality, bright white wools on a large framed, plain bodied animal in a challenging 525mm rainfall district with a very high incidence of wet days through winter.

Mernowie clients are extremely well placed to capitalise on low micron premiums, with stud adult ewes averaging 7kg 19.1 micron wool, and hoggets 17.5 micron.

The stud is putting emphasis on welfare traits with individual WEC and Dag results. The whole flock has been scored for wool colour and character. Results will flow through to this years ram sale team with ASBVs available for these traits

Mernowie targets sires with PWWT of +10, along with positive Fat and EMD.

Mernowie ewe lambs mated at 9-11 months of age have averaged 88% conception and over 100% average weaned lambs over a 10-year period.

Mothering ability is essential to achieving top lambing and we are now scoring ewes for temperament and udder size, we cull ewes that fail to rear a lamb. Clients are consistently weaning 110-130% lambs.

Our sale catalogue last year identified 63% of all sale rams were raised as multiples.

Our 2024 Al programs used a majority of Mernowie bred sires with some outside infusion with particular emphasis on meat eating quality, intra muscular fat and shear force.

Rams are sold to environments varying from 150mm to 750mm rainfall. We will be displaying at South East Merino Field Day at Keith and offering rams at Classings Classic, Murray Bridge.



FLINTOFTS LEAD REVIVAL OF ICONIC SA KNITTING MILL

ean and Melanie Flintoft have 25 years' experience in the fashion industry, with the launch and growth of eight different brands.

In their most recent endeavour, the pair have bought an iconic South Australian knitting mill, and are leading the charge to revitalise operations and protect Australian craftsmanship.

Silver Fleece knitting mill was first founded in 1951 in Hindmarsh, South Australia, and over the years, has become renowned for its highquality production and local craftsmanship, employing 20 local workers and technicians.

74 years on, in the same location, the mill uses state-of-the-art, computerised knitting machines, supplying schools, colleges and sporting clubs with South Australian-made garments. Most notably, for the last 40 years, Silver Fleece has knitted the iconic Australian cricket team woollen vests and pullovers, a contract which still stands today.

As consumer trends moved toward 'fast fashion', the former owner of Silver Fleece began to see declining order numbers, and heightened competition from global markets meant the business was at risk of closing down.

When they heard the news of Silver Fleece's struggle, Dean and Melanie Flintoft began to look into the process of acquiring the business. With backing from investors, the pair ultimately rescued Silver Fleece from liquidation, marking a turning point for the Australian manufacturing of wool products.

"We saw this as an opportunity to grow Australian manufacturing, and knitting is an area that involves advanced technology that helps with scaling and price," said Dean.

"We try to prioritise sustainability in everything we do. Silver Fleece already has a head start given most of what we create is made from Australian wool and Australian cotton, which are sustainable fibres, and even compostable in some cases."

The Flintofts are keen to synergise Silver Fleece with their established suite of fashion brands, including popular resort wear label Sunset Lover.

"We are very excited to make Australian manufacturing a focus of our brands going forward," Dean said.



"The next steps for Silver Fleece will be growth and expansion. We have capacity to expand significantly, and so we are working on government contracts, as well as working with other fashion brands and schools, to do more of what we specialise in."





NANTOURA

Nantoura's emphasis is on producing quickgrowing progeny producing 19 to 20 micron wool. All hoggets are visually classed for body and wool traits by classer Bill Walker and then objectively measured to aid selection. This selection process incorporates Sheep Genetics Australia to calculate ASBVs for growth rates, micron and wool growth. Ewe and ram lambs are body-weighed at weaning, six months and 12 months. Eye muscle depth and fat are measured at 12 months, allowing Nantoura to select the quickest-growing

and more highly muscled ewes and rams for its breeding program.

2008 marked a turn in our breeding at Nantoura. While several studs put in place a five-year plan to phase out mulesing, at Nantoura we ceased the practice. Several alternatives to mulesing have been considered but the only viable alternative to mulesing is the same option that got us there in the first place: breeding.

At Nantoura we don't attempt to coax our clients into ending mulesing, but we give them the opportunity to explore all their options. Nantoura will offer 100 paddock-run non-mulesed rams for auction on Tuesday 26 August.

NORTH ASHROSE

North Ashrose Merino and Poll Merino Stud is owned and operated by father and son, Tom and Angus Ashby. They are backed by generations of breeding stud Merinos - dating back to WB Ashby who founded the original stud in 1910.

The main property 'Bundaleer' is situated centrally between Spalding and Gulnare, approximately 50 kilometres north of Clare, in a 450mm rainfall area. North Ashrose is originally from a Collinsville blood base and has a consistent average micron of 20.2. The ewe flock has a solid background of structural soundness and constitution. North Ashrose Merino and Poll Merino sheep are sound in conformation and have strong carcass and meat traits, along with quality, well-nourished fibre while maintaining fleece weight on a plainbodied Merino. Tom and Angus continue to invest in leading genetics to improve and maintain the North Ashrose breeding objectives.



North Ashrose sold six rams at the 2024 Adelaide Ram Sale to a top price of \$16,000 and average of \$10,166. The 2024 on-property sale achieved another full clearance of 160 rams, with a top of \$9,000 and average of \$1,935

In 2025, North Ashrose will offer rams at the Adelaide Ram Sale (5 September) and On Property Sale (10 September), as well as private selections by appointment. We look forward to seeing you at the Elders SA Stud Merino Expo in Burra, the Australian Sheep and Wool Show in Bendigo and the Northern SA Merino Expo in Jamestown.

NORTH COWIE

North Cowie is renowned for breeding largeframed, plain-bodied and structurally correct sheep, carrying white nourished wools in the 18.5 to 20 micron range, making our clients' surplus sheep in the saleyards extremely desirable. Our rams are bred to thrive in any climate and environment, from the pastoral areas of SA and NSW to the high rainfall areas of the South East and Kangaroo Island. We at North Cowie put an emphasis on the measurable traits that provide clients a better return per hectare still with the ease of management at the front of mind.



PEPPER WELL

Pepper Well Poll Merino Stud was founded in 2005 and is located at Keyneton, SA. Sires in use include Kelvale, Ella-Matta, Richmond and Pepper Well.

We select for early-growth, plain medium size long body with good neck extension and heavy muscle in the loin and hind leg, which is attached to a huge pelvic area with a plain breach. These animals are covered with uncomplicated, super soft skins, draped in very long, white, bold, silky

soft, deeply crimped, aligned wool that can handle high rainfall. Mature ewes average 18 micron, and all lambs are un-mulesed successfully, since 2007. We have always had this focus at Pepper Well and our genetics are predictable and sound, satisfaction guaranteed.

The stock are run tough, stud included, without housing or foot paring. Fertility rates have been as high as 131% lambs marked to ewes mated, with clients regularly achieving 140%. Pepper Well is all about robust fertile sheep with very early growth, excellent wool and have the ability to put on weight fast when the feed is on. To do all this a soft supple skin is paramount.

SA sire evaluation 2024 drop entrant PW 22-2047 no data to report yet, but we did see the lambs at Turretfield get crutched and dag score collected in October with some handy lambs in a tough season. All the progeny are un-mulesed.

We will be exhibiting at South East Field Day at Keith on 23 July.

Pepper Well Poll Merino Stud's 2025 sale will be held on Wednesday 27 August at Keyneton.

PIMBENA

Pimbena is located at Wirrulla near Ceduna on the Evre Peninsula.

We joined Sheep Genetics in 2003, and all progeny have been vaccinated for OJD since 2006.

We are Brucellosis free accredited. Mulesing has not been done since 2006 and we have been AWEX accredited.

We run approximately 600 stud ewes, and all our sheep are paddock run. Regular weighing

and classing is done every 3 months. Our classer is Bill Walker of Classings Ltd.

All fleece weights and staple length are measured each shearing. Adult ewes average 7.2 to 12.1 kg of 18.5 micron.

All ewes are single mated with all lambs mothered up with D.O B. We aim to breed sheep that are dual purpose, fast growing, large frame with white soft handling wool.

Sires of this year's sale team include Flairdale 190212, 200052, 210214, 220097, and Pimbena 200249, 220611 and 230425. 611 is in the top 5% on sheep genetics; at 15 months old, cut 7.2 kg in 6 month wool.

Pimbena will be attending the Eyre Peninsula Pre-Sale Expo at Wudinna on 7 July.

Our on-property auction will be held on Wednesday 30 July at 1.30pm where approximately 80 rams will be offered.

PINDARI

Pindari Merino Stud was formed in 1966, while the Poll Merino Stud was registered in 1980, with many infusions of Moorundie Park over the early vears.

In recent years, Robin, Mary-Anne and Greg Schwartz have sought the judicious use of plain bodied, free growing, bold crimping sires, while maintaining conformation, to produce a more modern Poll Merino.

Rams with ASBVs have also been sought in recent years, targeting constant improvement in CFW, maintaining micron, and looking for above average WWT and genetic fat. This will continue the goal of easier care, faster growing, and genetically resilient Merinos.

We are consistently achieving lambing percentages of 104 to 113% in stud sheep. With the use of pregnancy scanning, and identifying twins, we plan to keep pushing these goals higher. At least 40% of the ewe flock is scanning up with multiples, with the challenge being to get more of these surviving to weaning with a July/August lambing.

Mature ewes consistently produce 7-8kg of wool per year, usually testing in the 19- 20 micron range, at high winter stocking rates, with only strategic worm control (drenching).

Rams are offered for sale for the first time at 14 months old in September, when our on-property ram auction is held, and privately at any time thereafter. They are offered with wool and muscle scan tests taken at around twelve months old (ie mid-August). Rams go to a mix of environments at this age and have performed well in the Upper North, Murray Mallee, and many mixed farming areas locally.

We would like to thank all bidders and purchasers at our 2024 auction, where these purely paddock run rams sold to \$2800, and averaged \$1192, which represented great value for both parties.

Seven-month-old ram lambs will be displayed at the 2025 Stud Merino Expo, as well as a selection of 18-month-old rams, plus stud ewes running with sires at that time.

Ram lamb progeny on display will include Ridgway (x Gunallo Gawny) as well as Ridgway Advance (x Glenlea Park 19 0190).

We will have a display on-property at Waterloo on Wednesday 12 March and look forward to catching up with all interested breeders then, and in the year ahead, including at the Mid North Inspection Day on Monday 25 August.

Our annual sale at Langhorne Creek will take place on Friday 8 August 2025 at 1.00pm and will feature many Radnor families plus our Collinsville and Orrie Cowie families.

Based in Tintinara in the Upper South East of SA, Ramsgate Stud is 100% commercially focused, aiming to breed industry relevant sires to further enhance your breeding program. Now more than ever, a truly dual-purpose Poll Merino, able to deliver more than one income stream is paramount.

RICES CREEK

2025 marks a major milestone for Rices Creek Poll Merino Stud, celebrating its centenary. Established in 1925, the stud is owned and managed by the Vandeleur Family on properties at Saddleworth in the Mid North and Tintinara in the South East of SA.

Rices Creek rams are sold to all Merino breeding areas from semi-arid pastoral to high rainfall and intensive grazing country. The stud strives to breed big, early maturing plain bodied sheep that have positive muscle and fat with productive wool growing skins. The Al program uses top Rices Creek rams with the best outside genetics available as well as incorporating DNA genomic testing to fine tune the breeding program.

In 2024, the on-property sale at Tintinara sold 104 rams with an average price of \$2167. Top price went to McPiggery, Lameroo for \$8000. The Saddleworth on-property sale achieved an average of \$1863 with a full clearance of 214 rams. The top price of \$7000 was purchased by the Bowden family, Rhynie. Rices Creek 23-5071 sold to Carunna Vale Poll Merino Stud, Jamestown for \$20,000.

In total, 318 rams were sold at auction including a full clearance of Hamilton Run rams for the second consecutive year. Complementing genetics of the Hamilton Run stud has proven successful with this year's sales and it has validated a demand for the stud's genetics. Private selection rams are available via appointment throughout the year.

This year's drop of Rices Creek and Hamilton Run ram lambs are looking good, and we are excited to see them progress. Progeny of Moorundie 001, purchased for \$50,000 in 2023 and Gunallo 463 will be available at our 2025 on-property auctions.

ABOUT THE STUDS

Selection for animals that have positive ASBVs for fat, eve muscle and early growth has resulted in lambs that reach marketable weights a lot earlier and also gives their clients the option to join ewe lambs if required.

The Ridgway flock is shorn every six months with their ewes producing between 4 and 5 kilograms of 18-19 micron fleeces, ranging from 60 to 75 millimetres in length, which is in line with most

processors' preference. The fibre produced is white, bold crimping and nourished, capable of withstanding all climatic conditions, ranging from the hot, dry pastoral areas to the higher rainfall, cooler environments in the southern regions.

The Ridgway sheep are not only plain bodied but carry free and supple skins that score well for both breech wrinkle and breech cover traits. Ridgway has ceased mulesing and believe breeders who use their genetics can also achieve this.

Ridgway is brucellosis accredited free and OJD MN3 accredited. They will be displaying at Bendigo, Hamilton and Keith in 2025 and invite all to their annual on-property ram sale of 130 rams on Monday August 11th at Kulkami, via Lameroo. Select rams will also be offered at Classings Classic and Adelaide Ram Sale and private selection rams will be available from late August.


The SWM flock consists of 4000 ewes which has an average fleece weight of 7.5kg per year at an

GEORGINA AUSTIN ON GROWING CABLE MELBOURNE AND THE POWER OF MERINO WOOL

its launch at Australian Fashion Week in 2007 to the expansion into a full collection. Georgina shares the story of Cable's growth, the enduring appeal of Australian Merino wool, and what's next for the brand.



Tell us a bit about the Cable brand.

Guided by a rich heritage in wool my subsequent love of knitwear led me to launch Cable in 2007 at Australian Fashion Week. Back then it was predominantly a knitwear brand, but we have since expanded the collection and introduced wovens to build out the range. Designed with the modern woman in mind, our collections showcase distinctive seasonal prints and colours, underpinned by unwavering quality, trusted wardrobe staples and timeless classics. With a renowned legacy in knitwear, Cable embodies the warmth and relaxed nature, unique to the Australian way of life

What is your background and how did the idea for Cable come about?

Formally trained as a graphic and textile designer, I have been in the fashion industry for over 20 years, working with Country Road, Nicholson and Decjuba in the early days. In 2007 Cable was launched as a dedicated knitwear brand, continuing the love of Australian wool that runs through my mother's side of the family. My great grandfather founded Thomas S. Beaumont & Sons. a leading buyer of Australian superfine Merino wool, leading four generations in the wool industry

What are some of the highlights since first starting the business?

Launching Cable at Australian Fashion Week was such an exciting moment for me personally, and the brand, and to think that we opened our 22nd store last year with more growth planned for 2025, I sometimes have to stop and pinch myself! I have been fortunate to work with some wonderful people over this period - at head office, store level and our suppliers - and none of this growth would have been possible without them.

Tell me a bit about your new Heritage 365 collection.

Last year we did a deep dive into our brand, in knitwear and Merino wool. It is where we started, and what Cable is known and loved

Heritage 365 is a collection of 44 of our most iconic knitwear styles that we are now going to offer year round, so if you're travelling to cold destinations during the Australian summer or anytime of the year, we will always have beautiful knitwear to take with you.

From March 2025 our Heritage 365 range will be available 365 days a year in our boutiques, online and in David Jones Elizabeth & Bourke

St stores in Sydney and Melbourne.

Heritage 365 includes our iconic long line cardigan, (one of the very first knitwear pieces I produced that developed an almost cult like following in the early days) along with a range of superfine seamless jumpers, wraps, layering pieces, socks, gloves and beanies in a colour palette of camel, grey, navy, antique white and grey marle.

The whole Heritage 365 Collection is certified by Woolmark.

What is so special about Merino wool?

I have always been obsessed with wool. It's such a beautiful, versatile fibre to work with, and the benefits are endless. It's sustainable, biodegradable, natural, it holds its colour, it can be used in different weights which lends itself to so many different garment applications, and you can wear it all year round as it temperature regulates. We are so lucky to have such beautiful Australian Merino wool at our fingertips in this country.

It is an industry I'm very proud to have supported for the past 17 years, working with local farmers to produce Cable's much-loved Merino collections

What is next for Cable?

We feel so fortunate that Cable has had such a great few years, so we hope to expand our retail footprint and make the brand accessible to more Australians, in addition to taking our Heritage 365 Merino offering to more people. Watch this space!



THE SNUGGERY

The Snuggery Poll Merino Stud, situated 35 km north of Kingston SE, was established in 1985 using selected ewes from our Merino stud which was formed on Collinsville bloodlines in 1941.

The stud's objective is to continue to produce superior medium wool, large, framed sheep, with excellent constitution and conformation.

We are committed to producing bright white, rich, heavy-cutting wool.

Continued genetic development has included the use of sires and semen from Mianelup, Banavie, Greenfields and Collinsville.

Our 37th annual on-property ram sale will be held on Thursday 18 September. The helmsman auction will begin at 2:30pm, with inspections of approximately 60 Poll Merino rams from 12.00pm.

WHITEHILL

Whitehill Poll Merinos are situated at Emu Downs, 30km south of Burra in SA's Mid North. Whitehill ewes average 19 micron and the hoggets 17.8 micron. Our medium to large frame ewes, carry a white, lustrous, crimpy wool on an easy-care, plain productive skin and are proven to do well in all environments.

We aim to continually introduce genetics to breed the above objectives and provide an affordable ram to drive profits through wool, carcass values and surplus sheep sales.

At our sale in 2024, we sold 91 rams to a top of \$4200, and an average of \$1769. Our sires are providing the free growing productive skins that are the main profit drivers for an easy-care merino, ensuring fertility, early growth and that white, lustrous, crimpy wool.

Client feedback tells of obvious genetic gain proving our sires breed on to type, showing improved style and cut with great carcass attributes while also turning off surplus lambs shortly after weaning at optimum trade weights.

We accept the prerequisite of our industry to have data to aid in ram selection. We have been collecting raw data and will continue to move forward and implement ASBVs in the future. We are strong believers in visual selection for structure and confirmation and breeding values can then be the extra information required to make informed decisions.

We will be participating with an on-property display as part of the Elders Burra SA Stud Merino Expo on Wednesday 12 March. as well as the South East Merino Field Day at Keith on Wednesday 23 July.

All rams are paddock reared, OJD vaccinated, and we are brucellosis accredited.

Our 2025 sale will be on Friday 29 August and we will be participating in the Mid North Inspection Day on Monday 25 August.

WHITE RIVER

At White River we now concentrate solely on breeding Poll Merinos. Our emphasis remains on early maturing, plain, well conformed bodies with high quality, long stapled, white wool, sure to fill the wool bale.

Our 2024 on-property ram sale was successful with our top price ram, Lot 2, selling for \$27,000 to Orrie Cowie, Nhill, With 144 out of 145 rams selling for an average of \$2336, Oak Farms, Buckleboo, took home Lot 5 for \$17,500.

We are excited for 2025 with progeny on offer from Moorundie 043 (purchased in 2023 for \$60,000) and Moorundie 0002, (purchased in 2022 for \$58,000) and Ridgway Advance 21671 (purchased for \$35,000 at Classing's Classic 2023), who has excellent data for us to utilise going forward.

This improved data available allows us to maintain our renowned body and fleece weights on our

structurally sound, well-conformed frames we are known for, with bright, white, long stapled, nourished wools. We continue to strive towards enhancing our data whilst maintaining our stud breeding values and visual selection to ensure we keep size, quality and profitability.

Once again we will have a selection of top guality rams on display throughout 2025, at Wudinna, Hay, Bendigo and the Northern SA Merino Expo. Our 2025 ram sale will be held at our Minnipa property again on Thursday 7 August, commencing at 1.00pm.

We always welcome enquiries and will host a full sale team inspection day on Friday 1 August, from 1.00 to 4.00pm. We are always happy to discuss your ram selection needs - we can help you find what you are looking for!

WIRRILLA RUN OP

Wirrilla Run owned and operated by Andrew Hall, is located between Mintaro and Manoora in South Australia's Mid North.

The current flock consist of a 650-ewe breeding base, that with stands harsh summer heat, subzero winters and natural doing ability on minimal hand feeding.

Our breeding objective is for an uncomplicated breeding ewe to be cutting 3 to 3.5kg of wool at 6 months at 60 to 70mm in length, producing white bright, lustrous and deeply crimped 19 micron

wool.

ASBVs are an integral tool used, whilst recording of visual traits such as Breech Wrinkle Score (BWR) allows our flock to continually to be nationally benchmarked.

Sires and keeper ram lambs are genomically tested, increasing ASBV accuracies, sire referencing and hard-to-measure traits.

Objective measurement is highly important, we see an animal's conformation as an extremely important starting point.

The 2024 program has produced some exciting sons from Ridgway Poll 220531 (purchased at Classing's Classic for \$8500) and Kelvale 221290.

We are excited with the prospects from the joining of our own sires such as Wirrilla Run 230020 & 230040, with several in the industry's top 5%, 10% and 20% for Yearling Weight (YWT), Eye Muscle Depth (EMD), Yearling & Adult Clean Fleece Weight (YCFW & ACFW) and Staple Length (YSL).

2024 sires include new sire Hamilton Run 235476 (Gunallo 463 Son), Kelvale 221290, Wallaloo Park 229 Sons, Ella Matta 210083 Sons.

We welcome all breeders and interested parties to inspect our stock anytime throughout the year, with rams for private selection from March onwards.

Wirrilla Run is brucellosis accredited free and MN3.

WITTALO

Situated 17 kilometres from Jamestown in the Mid North of South Australia, Wittalo Poll Merino is part of a mixed farming enterprise and was established in 2020

ABOUT THE STUDS

Originating from Fairdale bloodlines our breeding objectives focus on breeding a highly fertile Merino producing well-nourished white wool averaging 18 micron while still cutting heavy. A plain bodied sheep that is structurally sound and durable in all environments is also a goal being worked towards through selective breeding and introducing genetics.





The rams retained and sold in previous years are showing potential with lambs on the ground currently, we are hoping to see and hear more about these rams' progeny over the next year. We are also hoping to purchase a new ram and introduce some new genetics into the flock focusing on improving the flock average and improving flock quality.

WOODOONA

Steve Wood founded Woodoona Merino Stud at Borrika in 1958, with ewes and rams bought from Koonoona. The Poll Stud was first registered in 1983 on Koonoona and Pollville bloodlines. Woodoona runs 1800 ewes with a flock average of 19.5 micron in 325mm rainfall country at Borrika.

The stud sells rams to local and adjoining areas. including the South East, Kangaroo Island and into the pastoral country. Our focus on white nourished wools and thickness without skin has proven successful in all environments. Survivability and fertility are important to us, and we try to bring our rams up as naturally as possible. Customers are regularly getting well above 100% lambing in unscanned ewes.
