

MERINO DUAL PURPOSE SHINES **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**



elcome to the 2024 South Australian Stud Merino Annual Directory, vour quide to all aspects of what contributes to South Australia's world class Merino and Poll Merino industry.

In the last 12 months. South Australia has experienced a challenging season in many of the inside and pastoral regions. Not only was the season a challenge, lamb prices also stumbled due to the government announcement of phasing out the live sheep export trade via ship from Western Australia. In turn, Western Australian sheep producers off-loaded lambs into the eastern states sheep processing space, creating a downturn in lamb pricing due to oversupply. This again shows the importance of the versatility our sheep provide with the wool Eastern Market Indicator (EMI) starting the year at 1,333c/kg, reaching 1,400c/kg and ending at 1,212c/kg. At these levels wool is able to provide a certain level of

security. With greater focus on a sustainable

fibre in fashion, market indicators show positive and strong demand from wool buyers and processors continuing into 2024.

Highlights of 2023 included showcasing our excellent South Australian Merino genetics through our state regional field days, the ever growing and successful School Merino Wether Competition, as well as the annual Adelaide Ram Sale. Thank you to everyone who have supported and been instrumental in the organisation of these events. We were also proud to release the Merino SA Centenary Book at the Burra Expo which will be a treasured, historic piece to be passed down for many generations to enjoy. Thank you to the Centenary Book Committee for your attention to detail and making this come to life.

We welcomed Lin Cowling as our incoming Merino SA Executive Officer in May 2023, with Rachel Titlev taking on a new role. I would like to thank Rachel for her year with Merino





TRAINING FOR A BETTER INDUSTRY

earning on the job is one thing, but learning from industry legends is a sure way to improve.

MARCH STRING

The SCAA Shearer Woolhandling Training Incorporated (SCAA SWTI) courses have nailed this. A collaboration between the Shearing Contractors Association of Australia and AWI, this organisation is using highly skilled industry leaders to teach participants to become shearers and woolhandlers. SCAA Shearer Woolhandler Training Inc. is the leading provider of nationally accredited training for the wool industry. It is registered with the Australian Skills Quality Authority and has funding arrangements with state and Federal Governments. Various levels of shearing and woolhandling training are offered. Full details on these courses can be obtained from the SCAA Shearer Woolhandling Training website.

Executive Officer for SCAA SWTI, Glenn Haynes, coordinates an impressive group of trainers experienced in all aspects of wool harvesting. The team consists of over fifty five employees including administrators and trainers.

Training for shearing and woolhandling is shed based and designed to give real-world hands-

on experience, taught by industry leaders. Intensive one and two week schools are held throughout the year in South Australia, Victoria and Tasmania.

Shearing and woolhandling courses are designed for learners and improvers to provide a solid introduction to the Wool Harvesting industry and create a pathway to obtain ongoing employment. On completion of the course, graduates receive a nationally recognised Qualification or Statement of Attainment. They are highly sought after in the industry due to the high level of training.

"We keep a record of all trainees and follow them up to see how they are progressing with their skills," said Glenn.

"Retention of trainees within the industry has increased from around twenty five percent to over seventy."

This certainly shows the professionalism of the training organisation and is a huge bonus for the industry.

One of the successful programs involves an exchange of shearers with the Elite Wool Industry Training group from New Zealand.



Here, improver level shearers from Australia go to New Zealand to learn the New Zealand pattern for shearing their sheep. In return, promising New Zealand shearers come to Australia and learn how to shear Australian sheep.

One of the Australian trainers, Shannon Warnest, has been heavily involved in this.

"Some of the shearers can shear over four hundred a day back home, but struggle with our merinos," he said.

"We teach them about the balance, coordination and blow patterns required to shear Australian sheep."

They are taught five initial points for shearing our sheep.

- 1. Getting your gear and cut right.
- 2. Positioning and balance of the shearer and sheep.
- 3. Correct grip on the handpiece.
- 4. How to use your free hand to set up the sheep.
- 5. Correct entry of the handpiece onto the skin.

At the Glenstrae shearing shed near Willalooka in South Australia, Shannon spent time with the shearers and within a week lifted the standard and the tallies. Some tallies went from one hundred and fifty a day to over two hundred. This incredible lift in quality and productivity is a real boost for both the shearers and the producer.

The national investment in shearer and woolhandler training is certainly paying dividends and the creation of a new breed of professionals will strengthen our sheep industry.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA'S OWN WINS NATIONAL SHEARING TITLE



ongratulations to Nathan Meaney on becoming Australian Open Shearing Champion.

Nathan, from Kapunda, has been in the South Australian team for fifteen years, and becomes just the fourth person to hold the national prize.

Nathan represented Australia in 2022 at the World Titles in Scotland and carried his fitness through to the competition at Jamestown. Taking out the title in his home state makes it even more special.

Nathan carries his competition quality into the sheds and believes that it is important for shearers to do a professional job. Nathan said competing with and against former champions Shannon Warnest and Daniel McIntyre, has helped him reach such high standards.

YOUNG AMBASSADORS LEAD THE WAY IN WOOL TRAINING

any industries and sporting organisations use mentors and role models to encourage participation. SCAA Shearer Wool Training Inc (SCAA SWTI) is no exception, and is using outstanding young participants to encourage new entrants to the industry.

In 2018, the Shearing and Woolhandling Ambassador Team was started. Executive Officer Glenn Haynes believes that the team has had a massive effect on retention in the industry. The Ambassadors work with novice trainees and provide mentoring for the new entrants.

"When these leaders, who have only been in the industry for one or two seasons perform so well, it certainly inspires the new participants," Glenn said.

Each year in June, two shearers and one wool handler are chosen to undertake a 12-month ambassador program with SCAA SWTI. They are selected based on the following criteria:

- Presentation and conduct in shed and out of hours
- Team and leadership qualities
- Outstanding talent in their field and potential to excel
- Willingness to learn and improve
- They are second- or third-year entrants to the wool industry
- The wool handler must aspire to undertake Certificate IV in Wool Classing
- The shearers must undertake or have achieved Certificate III in Shearing
- They must be interested in competing in sports shear competitions.

The ambassadors are required to compete in a minimum of three sport shears across the state, where they will attend in full uniform and must recognise all sponsors when they win prizes.

They also attend field days and career promotional days when needed as role models.

The ambassadors receive personal mentoring from the advanced trainers in all industry aspects, including skills, competitions, business, and finance.

These young leaders attend SCAA SWTI trainers' workshops. This is to encourage them to become trainers in the future. Additionally, all are encouraged to be involved with the media.

For their efforts, the shearer ambassadors receive \$3,000 worth of equipment and clothing from Heiniger. The wool handler receives a Certificate IV in Wool

Classing scholarship, including travel and accommodation, \$2,500 from Prime Super and a \$1,000 voucher for ioMerino clothing. Uniforms are also kindly supplied by ioMerino. Ambassadors compete at the New Zealand Shearing Championships and attend a precompetition training day.

Since the program began in South Australia in 2018, seven shearers and three woolhandlers have represented their state. The SA wool ambassador for 2021, Sarah Haynes, won the AWEX national wool classing title at the Sydney Royal Show and also became the 2022

National Senior Champion.

Five shearing and two wool handling ambassadors have now completed their Certificate IV and are delivering training in South Australia and Victoria.

Glenn explained that he hopes the more role models like the ambassadors are promoted, the more young people in the industry might aspire to be like them.

"We are hoping this will make a change to a more professional profile in the industry," Glenn said.

MERINO FAITH IN DROUGHT RE-BUILD

outh Australia is the driest state on the driest continent on earth, and the 2018 to 2020 drought was especially challenging for pastoral operations. For the Morgan family's Mutooroo Pastoral Company that period yielded two of the top ten lowest annual rainfall years in the company's history.

Managing and then rebuilding sheep numbers centred around the Merino breed's ability to reproduce, giving the company great confidence, Ed Morgan said.

"The spring 2023 sheep market decline further highlights the importance of our wool clip heading into 2024 and beyond," Ed said.

With the drought onset, the first strategy was to supplementary feed the stud flock and priority selected commercial mobs. Other commercial sheep were sold, and those funds directed to drought-related costs; continued feeding, dam-cleaning, and opening scrub country.

Ed explained that they moved on agistment when the drought broke in the eastern states.

"In 2020 we secured agistment for our stud flock and 75 per cent of our commercial breeding ewes, and had sheep on sixteen different properties over four states, with

"We did our own lamb marking, crutching, and shearing. This was a logistical feat given the distances, unknown properties, and districts. But it was a great learning exercise for us, as

northern NSW being a key area," he said.

staff from our different properties helped to process all the stock away from home. Our properties in the north east were still running stock so this was a busy period.

"The agistment and feeding programs gave us the nucleus to rebuild our flock. Our strategy was to hold our numbers at a critical level, so we were not re-stocking with high-decile valued breeding ewes. We did have to top up our commercial numbers from WA and SA to begin our natural increase re-build. From 2020 to 2023 we managed to re-build from 18,000 to 80,000 head.

"Strong lamb marking percentages have been a feature of our rebuild. Our stud flock percentages for paddock joined unscanned ewes were: 113 per cent in 2021, 127 per cent in 2022, and 114 per cent in 2023. Our commercial flock has averaged just over 100% the last three years across Lilydale, Mutooroo and Mulyungarie.

At the 2022 Yelta Sale, Mutooroo topped the market at \$308 with May/June drop young ewes and again in 2023 at \$164.

Elders appreciates the passion and endeavour shown by pastoralists and acknowledge their importance in meat and wool production.

Our members would once again like to thank Elders for their long-standing commitment to this event, being the major sponsor for many years.





THE AUSTRALIAN **WOOL TRACEABILITY HUB**

onsumers are increasingly demanding traceability in their products, and a joint project between Australian wool's industry bodies is soon set to deliver this. In 2021, Wool Producers Australia (WPA) published a report into traceability in the Australian Wool Industry. It highlighted the importance of Australian Wool Innovation (AWI), Australian Wool Exchange (AWEX) and Australian Wool Testing Authority (AWTA) working together to provide an industry database for traceability.

The National Council of Wool Selling Brokers of Australia (NCWSBA) and the Australian Council of Wool Exporters and Processors (ACWEP) initiated informal discussions involving AWI and AWEX.

More recently the group has involved AWTA, WPA and the Australian Association of Stud Merino Breeders. This group formalised the creation of the Australian Wool Traceability Hub (AWTH).

It was agreed that the concept for the Hub was to create a two-way traceability system from grower to first stage processor and should:

1. Be managed by AWTA.

2. Support Australian Wool's Emergency Animal Disease response plan.

- 3. Respect the confidentiality and commercial interests in the current supply chain.
- 4. Accommodate RFID enabled wool packs and capture of grower PIC data. This would be critical for rapid response to an Emergency Animal Disease Outbreak.
- 5. Be a platform for Integrity Schemes (for example, RWS, SustainaWOOL and Authentico) and verify membership.
- 6. Allow the input of grower profiles to showcase their business and validate these declarations.
- 7. Interoperability with industry systems including AWEX's WoolClip, eBale and AWTA test data and certificates.

The AWTH will respect the confidentiality and commercial interests of the current supply chain and have a clear data privacy and data access policy. There will be an opt in/opt out functionality for all systems and there will be no collection or dissemination of price data.

To further develop the concept, an industry working group, comprising representatives from AWI, AWTA and AWEX, was formed. The working group was established beneath a steering committee of the Wool Industries Australia executive committee which governs the strategic direction, functional requirements and resourcing of the project.



consultation and development. "We have started scoping out the project and it is progressing well. Ultimately the Hub's success will depend on the willingness of the industry to back it." "We want to bring the AWTH to the market quickly without imposing more unnecessary

costs, which is why we are leveraging from AWI's infrastructure and collaborating on the development work" he said. "We also plan to utilise industry data that is currently distributed throughout the supply chain to minimise administrative overheads and users will be able to control where and how that



AWTH project manager John Billing explained that a soft launch of the new Hub is targeted to take place in Adelaide at the International Wool Textile Organisation Congress in April 2024.

"We are targeting that soft launch first, and then hoping to have a commercial system available by the beginning of the 2024-25 wool selling season," Mr Billing said.

"Those deadlines are tentative; there's a lot to do in terms of background work to meet those targets, including widespread industry

occurs. This includes integration with AWEX

WoolClip system and the use of electronic bale identification tags. That's where the declaration of Property Identification Code is crucial as it provides the link back to the grower."

There is widespread support for the concept from all parties involved. This is shown clearly by the rapid progress made by the steering committee

AWI Chief Executive Officer, John Roberts has been heavily involved and is very supportive of the concept.

"The Australian Wool Traceability Hub represents a significant priority for AWI," said Mr Roberts

"In collaboration with our industry partners, our focus is on future-proofing Australian wool. We view AWTH as a key tool for improving risk management for biosecurity and market access. Through this collective effort, we are poised to strengthen the Australian wool industry, ensuring its resilience and competitiveness in the global market."

Further collaboration between the AWTH and growers should ensure that the traceability system is a winner.

Flairdale continues to breed medium wooled plain-bodied sheep with large frames and long stapled, free-growing white wool paying close attention to wool cutting ability.

Flairdale has been mules-free for 17 years and shearing at 6 months. All Stud ewes and rams are electronically tagged enabling us to use the latest technology to assist us with our breeding program. We currently use Breedelite sheep in conjunction with ASBVs to enable us and our clients to best select rams to suit their wool and meat growing enterprise. 








REMEMBERING TOM PADBURY





stalwart of the Australian Merino industry, Tom Padbury sadly passed away in late 2023.

Tom began his career with Elder Smith & Co, gaining technical knowledge and experience in wool, at which time Mr AL Collins (Art) recognised his talent and ability, inviting him to join the team at Collinsville.

He worked his way through the ranks, and after 12 years working alongside Mr Collins, Tom was made stud master and classer of Collinsville. During his tenure, Collinsville was able to attain a number of world records, which are still held today. This includes the \$450,000 sale of a Merino ram, and the \$280,000 sale of a Poll Merino ram.

Much of this success has been attributed to Tom's incredible ability to breed true dualpurpose sheep, tailored to their environmental conditions. He remained at Collinsville until 1995, and then continued to advise and assist Merino breeders in all corners of Australia. In 1996, Tom became an advisor to the Sullivan family at Greenfields.

Jim Sullivan said Tom was a great sheep man, who made a significant contribution to the Merino sheep breeding industry.

"We were very fortunate that Tom became our consultant and advisor at Greenfields, and we benefitted greatly from his contribution to helping our stud progress," Jim said.

"He did a lot of work in promoting the industry more widely, delivering papers on breeding Merinos to seminars and world conferences.

"He was only too willing to share his knowledge and experiences with everyone in the industry, and he had a great love of the Merino.

"His legacy will continue to live on through the outstanding work he did."

Tom continued his work as a consultant and advisor for many years, and also worked alongside Chris England from The Snuggery at Kingston.

"I first met Tom in the late 60s, at the Adelaide Show, and we kept in contact ever since," Chris said.

"In 1986, he started coming out to help us class our rams when we introduced our Poll Stud. From then on he came out a few times a year, all the way through until 2019.

"He taught us a lot. One of the main things he really taught us was about structure and confirmation in sheep, he always wanted to get the sheep right first, and worry about the wool second. Whereas a lot of people did it the other way around.

"He used to come and stay with us when he would come over to work, and we got on really

well. We always enjoyed those days."

Sydney Lawrie, from Collandra North at Tumby Bay, echoed Jim and Chris' comments, saying Tom was only too willing to share his knowledge and experience with others in the industry.

"It was great to have Tom Padbury work with us for many years," Sydney said.

"His knowledge and influence on our business, including me personally, and the industry as a whole, was amazing."


In 2002, Tom was awarded an Order of Australia for his service to the industry.





60 YEARS THE SOUTH EAST MERINO FIELD DAYS




n 1963, a meeting was held at Arch Prosser's home before a public gathering at the Tintinara Hotel. That evening, the South East Stud Merino Breeders' Association was born.

By 1964, the Association was officially established, and their first-ever field day and was held, involving seven studs who displayed their sheep in the Tintinara Saleyards, along with additional on-property displays.

Six decades on, and the Association is preparing to celebrate 60 years of the iconic event.

In its fifth year, the event had outgrown Tintinara and moved to Keith. At the 20th Field Day, the event saw 20 studs participating, and now included the Keith Ram Sale. This involved



By 1986, the event had evolved again. becoming a two-day event, with 13 studs displaying on their properties. Day 1 covered Bordertown, Mundulla and Keith, and day 2 covered the Keith, Tintinara and Coonalpyn area

The millennium brought a 'new look' for the event, replacing the traditional two-days with a single day field day and the Keith Ram Sale on the following day.

The evolving format saw the 2017 event capture 24 studs from the South East, Mallee and Yorke Peninsula regions, showcasing their profit-driving dual-purpose genetics at Keith.

The event has seen enormous changes over six decades. Not only in the style and type of the Merino sheep on display, but also in the venue and the number of studs that gather from across South Australia. The journey from displaying on-property to gathering at one site and displaying in marques at Keith, centrally located in the South East has become a huge drawcard

GUM HILL

Gum Hill is a Poll Merino Stud owned and operated by the Lines family in South Australia's Mid North

Established by the family in 1885, the Stud has experienced the hardships and enjoyed the prosperity of the sheep and wool industry across its 138 year history. Gum Hill became one of the first sheep Studs to use objective measurement of physical production traits, including greasy fleece weight and yearling bodyweight. This measurement process began in the 1950s. Since

then, the Stud has taken a balanced approach, considering measured traits and visual subjective assessment in selecting the plain bodied, fertile, resilient, easy care Poll Merinos that our clients desire.

2023 was another year of significance in the Stud's history. A genomics program, including a foundational university Study into our flock's genetic parameters, heritability, and correlations for a variety of traits was commenced. Understanding the genetic traits that can influence our clients' flocks, along with their environments will allow us to continue and build upon our long history of using science and data as selection tools in our breeding program.

We now have over 10,000 sheep genomically tested in our data set. The collection of this genetic information, in conjunction with measured data has produced enhanced 'Genomic Estimated Breeding Values' of high accuracy and repeatability on highly inherited traits. Our partnership with the University of Adelaide's Davies Livestock Research Centre to produce these values will enable us to drive our genetic progress forward, tailoring breeding values and Indexes to our client's needs.

At field days in 2024 we will have preliminary genomic estimated breeding values available for all rams.

This includes those displayed in March, on property, and at Keith in July. Rams are available for private selection on property from August to October.

GUNALLO

Gunallo Poll Merino Stud is situated 8 km south of the Mallee Highway between Murrayville and Pinnaroo.

Gunallo breeds uncomplicated sheep that are early maturing, fertile with long stapled, crimpy white wools on the large frame that our sheep are noted for.

Gunallo sheep have strong constitutions and are working towards a mule's free sheep with positive fat and eve muscle.

Extensive artificial insemination has been instrumental in achieving these goals as well as advice from our Stud classer Bill Walker.

In 2023, Gunallo sold rams to a top price of \$20,000 to Sandalwood Poll, Karoonda. Gunallo rams and semen are currently going to most states.

2023 has been tough year price wise for lambs and surplus ewes so it is more important to breed profitable sheep which are easy care.

We are looking to this year's young rams which are showing plenty of potential with more rams having elite, free-growing wools on large frames.

Sires used for this year's rams includes first progeny of Gunallo 431, Gunallo 625, Gunallo 713, Glenlea Park 1063, RA 1437, Leahcim 2477, EJ 5492. There are more Mernowie 1080, Gunallo 470, Gunallo 551, Gunallo 264, Mumblebone 532 plus other leading sires

Gunallo is accredited Brucellosis free and is MN3 status Sheep MAP.

In 2024, Gunallo will be displaying Rams in Bendigo, Keith, Hamilton. We will also be selling at Classings Classic Ram Sale and Adelaide.

Our 45th annual on-property ram sale will be held on Thursday 29 August 2024. Current wool tests will be available on all rams to be offered, as well as ASBVs from SheepGenetics, inspections are also welcome.

Hill View was founded in 1891 by E.H. Starkey, by the purchase of 100 ewes from A. Gilmour, Mount Pleasant, SA, which were mated with rams from A.J. Murray, Mount Crawford, Williamstown, SA.

In 2012, the Stud ownership passed to Lyall Starkey who went into partnership with his daughter Kayla, trading as K.M. & L.W. Starkey. Since taking on this partnership, Lyall and Kayla have bred Merinos suitable for their cold winters and over 600mm annual rainfall, and this has resulted in breeding animals which we feel best suit our climatic conditions.

Our wool types range from fine-medium to medium wools, that are bright, pearly white, well defined in crimp and soft to the touch. We also bring carcass quality to our sheep, and while they may not look big at first glance, the capacity of depth in the barrel region, and length, gives us the opportunity to grow dual-purpose Merinos in our climatic conditions.

Hilton Heath Poll and Merino Studs are located 45km east of Keith in the McCallum area in a 400 to 425mm rainfall zone and at Sanderston, east of the Mt Lofty Ranges.

Hilton Heath sheep have become more relevant in today's dual market place of wool and meat. The approach of combining data with visual assessment is producing high quality sheep sought after by both straight Merino enterprises and cross breeding systems. We have utilised Sire Evaluation trials, showing and field days to showcase our animals and their attributes to commercial and stud producers locally and interstate.

The success of our clients in both meat and wool as well as surplus ewe sales further reinforces our direction and confidence in our breeding programs. Sires in use in the Poll Stud include Hilton Heath, Terrick West, Nyowee, Poll Bonooke and Carcuma North. In our Merino stud we are using Hilton Heath, Wanganella, Collinsville, Orrie

Cowie (purchased at the Adelaide Ram Sale for \$11,000). All sires have been selected for their long staple, bright white wool with crimp and lustre. The structure of the fleece is also a strong focus to allow for high yielding wools and high fleece weights on uncomplicated bodies.

Over the past three years our average wool tests have been resulted in 19.5 to 20.5 micron, 8 to 9kg fleece weight per head and 69 to 72 per cent vield.



KELVALE

The Kelvale Poll Merino Stud was founded in 1966 by the Kellock family, and is now managed by Stephen and Peta Kellock at Keith in the South Fast

Today, there are 1000 Stud ewes that are mated to Kelvale bred sires with outside influence via Al and ET programs.

The main breeding objective of the Stud is to produce a well-balanced animal for both wool and meat production. This is achieved by improving the density, length and quality of the wool grown on a highly productive animal, with high growth rates.

Kelvale is currently shearing every six months and obtaining testing lengths in excess of 70mm, however our aim is to genetically breed the length to above 80mm consistently. Deep crimping and bold, white wools are grown with an average flock micron of 19.0.

Maintaining and breeding a plain-bodied sheep has allowed for the practice of mulesing to be phased out, and no lambs have been mulesed since 2008. We have also increased our lambing percentage to be consistently over 110 per cent from ewes mated with some mobs achieving over 130 per cent in recent years.

Kelvale is actively involved in the collection and use of data within sheep genetics. The ASBV data is invaluable to continually evaluate and improve wool and carcass traits, with positive fat and muscle of high importance for survivability of lambs. We participate in sire evaluation trials and have had great consistent genetic results.

Kelvale is a founding member of SRS® Genetics, as we are prepared to breed a highly productive sheep that will thrive anywhere in Australia. Rams are sold into Tasmania, Victoria, NSW, Queensland, and all over South Australia. See our website to learn more about the events where Kelvale rams will be on display.

KURRABI PARK

Kurrabi Park Poll Merino Stud was registered in 2014 and is located at Koppio on the lower Eyre Peninsula, with an average annual rainfall of 500 millimetres.

The Stud is an entirely non-mulesed flock and mulesing ceased within our commercial ewe flock in 2007. Since ceasing mulesing, we have not noticed any detrimental effects to question this decision.

Our breeding objectives include white, bright, medium wool on a structurally sound, easy care, dual-purpose frame. Our bloodline was founded on North Ashrose, since then we have introduced genetics from Moorundie Park, Glenlea Park, Roemahkita, Leahcim, Calcookara and O'Brien Poll Merino.

We are focused on using MerinoSelect as an important sire buying tool, with the intent to head down this path in our stud, as it provides us

with objective information to assist in our breeding decisions along with physical assessment of wool and structural confirmation

LAMPATA

Lampata Poll Merino Stud is a family business, run by Bruce, Gaylia, Robert and Courtney Pocock, and first registered in 1982.

Lampata is based at Lameroo in the southern Mallee of South Australia and is run in conjunction with their other farming enterprises, cropping and commercial sheep. Lampata Poll Merinos are indexed in the top 10 per cent Dual Purpose Index for sheep genetics flock profile.

All sheep are paddock run and mated to give full and honest assessment under commercial conditions, just as is required in commercial clients' flocks.

Lampata's emphasis is on producing affordable and highly productive, plain-bodied, fertile and genuine dual-purpose rams for the commercial producer. Excellent returns are being made by their clients when selling wool or surplus stock.

Approximately 600 of their own surplus ewes are offered and highly sought after at the Annual Lameroo Off Shears Sale, with many used to breed top lines of maternal ewes and prime lambs for our clients.

Lampata runs 1625 ewes, including 730 stud ewes. Their average flock micron is 20.5 for ewes and 19.5 for hoggets. They have stayed in this medium micron range to maximise overall

productivity and profitability. Their staple length allows for twice yearly shearings, which also gives

management advantages.

They initially select 300 ram lambs each year, later reducing that to the top 150 visually, which are then widely assessed for fleece weight, micron, staple length, birth type, growth, fat and eye muscle.

All rams are Brucellosis accredited and OJD Gudair vaccinated.

We will be displaying at the SE Merino Field Day.

Lampata will sell rams at their annual on-property sale on Monday 19 August 2024, and privately.

Sheep Genetics data assessment for over 30 years has given Leahcim one of the most accurate and largest databases in Australia. Using large numbers of follicle density measurements over the last five years to increase wool quality, skin quality and production, measuring large numbers of individual worm egg counts to increase worm resistance, identifying, and using genetic with some of Australia's best meat eating

quality sires will take Leahcim and our clients to the next level of advanced profitability and ethical breeding.

Leahcim has ventured into having some of our wool processed into tops, craft yarns, commercial yarns, and also various woven and knitted products. The product is fully traceable, ethically produced and 100% Australian processed. The product is marketed as Leahcim Wool – 'Farm to Yarn to You', online and at Hummocks Station, one of South Australia's pioneer sheep stations. Leahcim has been approached by one of Australia's largest wool processors to develop a joint venture branded product that highlight the sustainability and traceability of our Leahcim

Leahcim's data is available on the Sheep Genetics website and will be available on every sheep in the 2024 ran sale. All Leahcim sheep are genomic tested for parentage identification and genotyped to maximise traceability and allow us to select for hard-to-measure traits, which will maximise our genetic gains.

LUCERNBRAE

Lucernbrae is located in the Bremer Valley, surrounded by rocky hills, north of Callington with an average rainfall of 370mm. Our family has been breeding Merino sheep for over 70 years.

Lucernbrae Stud has concentrated on breeding Merino sheep that meet the demand of producers and consumers who require the sheep industry to address future ethical issues. We concentrate on breeding wrinkle free, plain bodied sheep and ceased mulesing in 2007. Our aim is to breed elite sheep with soft, stylish white wool around 18.5 micron.

Current ewe hoggets carrying 5 months' wool were shorn and tested 17.5 micron, cutting 3 kg wool. Ewe hoggets with 8 months wool have cut on average 6 kg and 110mm. Shearing occurs twice yearly with maidens being shorn three times in every two years. The Stud is Ovine Brucellosis and OJD accredited MM3. ASBVs are adding to our sheep genetic data with some exciting results.

2023 ram sale sold 50 rams to repeat clients with two new clients added on sale day. Unfortunately the predictions of a forth coming drought meant prices were subdued with the top price of \$3000 sold to the Thiele family and average of \$1406.

With the future of the sheep industry looking for easy care, ease of shearing, plainer skins, and lower microns, we too are breeding in this direction. We have actual figures on our rams, body weight,

fleece weight, current wool test, muscle and fat measurements and pedigree. We are Brucellosis accredited and OJD vaccinated.

Last year, we sold our top priced ram to Canowie Poll Merino Stud for \$10,000. He was bred from our GLP sire. This year we will be offering more of his sons, as well as the first sons of Kamora Park 115 that we purchased for \$22,000. His current test is 17.4 micron. He was a stand out sheep at the South East Merino Field Day in 2021.

We continue to breed horned Merino rams as we think they still have an X-factor in their genetic background that result in a more productive animal. The quality of our horns is as good as the polls but in more of a traditional style

Our 5-year average of our ewe flock is 20 micron. Lambs at 6 months weigh up to 70kg. Mallee Hill ewes cut 8.5kg each year, with individual ewes cutting 11kgs of fleece. Our wool is white, has lustre and good nourishment. Along with measured traits, care is given to select for basic traits like structure, good feet and general do-ability.

Mallee Hill Rams will be displayed at the Broken Hill Ag Fair, Wudinna and Keith Merino Field Days.


rate and many other traits have all been used to give us the versatile and reliable producing Malleetech sheep we have today.



MERNOWIE

Ian Rowett founded the Mernowie Stud in 1975 and son David is now joint Stud master. Mernowie is located at Marrabel, 100km north of Adelaide, between the Clare and Barossa Valleys.

The Mernowie Stud is renowned for its ability to produce top quality, bright white wools on a large framed, plain bodied animal in a challenging 525mm rainfall district with a very high incidence of wet days through winter.

Mernowie clients are extremely well placed to capitalise on low micron premiums, with Stud adult ewes averaging 7kg skirted 19.1 micron wool, and hoggets 17.5 micron.

The Stud has a priority to breed genetic resistance to worms and has a management program to increase fertility. A number of clients are consistently weaning up to 130 per cent lambs. Ewes failing to rear a lamb each year are culled.

We are targeting sires with PWWT of +10, ewe lambs have been mated 10 to 11 months old, average conception 89 per cent and over 100 per cent lambs weaned average over 10 years.

Mernowie 201080 sold at Classings Classic 2021

for \$20,000 to Gunallo Stud. Progeny will feature heavily in our 2024 sale. PWWT 9.48, YWT 12.28, YEMD 2.07, YCFW 24.17, YFD -1.28

About 900 Stud ewes are artificially inseminated annually, with parentage now recorded on all sheep. Most Stud ewes have been genomics and poll/horn tested.

Our 2023 AI programs used a majority of Mernowie bred sires with the average of all sires used: PWWT 9.5, YWT 11.99, YCFW 25.4, YEMD 1.38, YFAT 0.3, YFD -0.9.







SCHOOL MERINO WETHERS COMPETITION



he 2023 School Merino Wether competition was an excellent success again this year with near record entries.

Thirty-eight schools entered a total of 73 teams of three merinos - a total of 219 sheep.

The schools sourced their wether lambs from Merino breeders in early March, at which time they were shorn, and later body weighed by an approved inspector from Merino SA.

The students feed and care for the sheep, gaining hands-on experience in animal husbandry and animal health such as drenching, vaccinating and animal nutrition.

The teams of wethers arrived at the Adelaide Showgrounds early in the week of the competition, having had wool samples taken from a mid-side sample several weeks earlier by a Merino SA Inspector.

Experienced scanner Rachel Chirgwin weighed the teams on arrival and scanned them for eye muscle depth and fat. All animals were also mouthed to ascertain whether they are lambs or hoggets.

This is an important process and can result in significant discounts for animals that are classed as hoggets. The estimated carcass value for each animal is calculated from the current grid price offered by Thomas Foods.

Luke Schreiber of Spence Dix & Co, along with Bill Baade kicked off the judging. This commenced with a visual assessment of each team to select the most even pen of wethers, taking into consideration structural conformation and soundness. Anthony Hurst once again judged the Rabobank Handlers Competition.

Like many other aspects of the competition, the schools have lifted the standard in these competitions considerably over the years.

All of the sheep were then shorn on the final day of the competition, with well-known shearing identity Glenn Haynes coordinating this section and providing live commentary on the micron to the gathered crowd and contestants.

Australian Wool Network representatives Jarred Phillips and Rob Williams finally collected wool values for each animal. These are calculated on current markets, with micron and yield of each fleece having been ascertained from previously taken side samples, along with the fleece weight.

The School Merino Wether Competition would not be possible without the generous support from sponsors the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of SA, Australian Wool Innovation, Mutooroo Pastoral, Spence Dix &

Co. Thomas Foods International, Australian Wool Network, Urrbrae Agricultural High School, Elders, Rabobank, and Rick Baldock Stockowners Shearing.

I would also like to thank the stewards who generously gave up their time over the two days of the event – thank you to Francis Andrews, Simon Seppelt, Jessica Cousins, and Peter Conrick.

A special mention to Stephen and Peta Kellock who both contributed a huge amount during the transition as I took on the coordinating role for the event.

Thanks also to Lin Cowling in the Merino SA office for her work collating the data and liaising with the schools.

The School Merino Wether Competition continues to go from strength to strength, and I plan to invite more schools to get involved next year.

The schools and the students are to be commended for their efforts, they all do an excellent job presenting themselves and their wethers to a very high standard.



Eve muscle depth and fat are measured



at twelve months, allowing Nantoura to select the quickest-growing and more highly muscled ewes and rams for its breeding program.

2008 marked a turn in our breeding at Nantoura. While several studs put in place a 5-year plan to phase out mulesing, at Nantoura, we ceased the practice entirely. Several alternatives to mulesing have been considered but the only viable alternative to mulesing is the same option that got us there in the first place - breeding.

At Nantoura we don't attempt to coax our clients into ending mulesing, but we give them the opportunity to explore all their options.

Again, we entered a sire in the SA Sire Evaluation OB201166, he performed as he did in stud and as ASVBs predicted, a great benchmark for the rest of the sire team. 
that challenge our clients. These profit driven objectives are continually reviewed to ensure Old Ashrose sheep remain relevant to current and future requirements.

Gerald & Jodie Mullighan - Wyara Poll Merino Stud

1. Tell us a bit about yourselves and your backgrounds

The Mullighan family has been breeding Merinos in the mid north of South Australia since 1950, after relocating from Towitta on the Murray Flats. We, along with our three daughters Kasey, Marie and Lainey, now reside in the Andrews district on our mixed farming property 'Wyara'. We breed Merinos, and also grow wheat, barley, oats and lucerne. In our limited spare time, we are also involved in breeding and racing thoroughbreds, and in local sport, including netball, basketball and tennis.

2. How long has your family been involved with Merinos?

Gerald is a third generation farmer with a passion for breeding Merinos. His father Ross, who passed away two years ago at the age of 93, instilled in him a solid work ethic, and liked to breed his own rams.

After the move in 1950, Ross purchased rams and occasionally 10 CFA Stud ewes from Old Bungaree. Between 1990 and 2000, we decided we needed to reduce the micron and improve the handle of the wool. whilst keeping our large frame. Stud rams were then sourced from the Riverina in NSW, from One Oak, Sims Uardry and Wanganella.

Since then, Gerald has produced long, deep bodied sheep with heavy fleeces of beautiful, soft white, crimped wool, with a 20 micron average. These traits are now being continued with our Poll Merinos.

3. What or who encouraged you to become a stud breeder?

In 2020, we decided that if we wanted to sell some rams, it would have to be Poll Merino rams, with the dream of becoming a Stud. Our first Poll was bought from Poll Boonoke. To compliment him, we purchased 47 Poll Stud ewes from Greenfields. The progeny were excellent, so the big decision was made by us and our eldest daughter Kasey, to form the Wyara Poll Merino Stud.



4. What do you love about South Australia's Merino industry?

Sheep and wool are a big part of our lives and we are passionate about breeding good quality sheep with excellent wool. We are lucky to be in this industry with likeminded people, and experience the highs and lows together, doing what we love.

5. What are you most looking forward to as a stud breeder?

We are looking forward to meeting other Merino breeders, and talking and learning more about the Stud industry. We also are excited to being able to sell some quality rams to people who will appreciate them.

6. What do you hope to achieve in the next few years?

In the next few years, we are hoping to hold some regular clients and sales, with rams that will help improve other Merino breeders' flocks.

ABOUT THE STUDS

PINDARI

Pindari Merino Stud was formed in 1966, while the Poll Merino stud was registered in 1980, with many infusions of Moorundie Park over the early years.

In recent years, Robin, Mary-Anne and Greg Schwartz have sought the judicious use of plain bodied, free growing, bold crimping sires, while maintaining conformation, to produce a more modern Poll Merino.



Rams with ASBVs have also been sought in recent years, targeting constant improvement in CFW, maintaining micron, and looking for above

average WWT and genetic fat. This will continue the goal of easier care, faster growing, and genetically resilient Merinos.

We are consistently achieving lambing percentages of 104 to 113% in stud sheep. With the use of preg scanning, and identifying twins, we plan to keep pushing these goals higher. At least 40% of the ewe flock is scanning up with multiples, with the challenge being to get more of these surviving to weaning with a July/August lambing.

Mature ewes consistently produce 7 to 8kg of wool per year, usually testing in the 19 to 20 micron range, at high winter stocking rates, with only strategic worm control (drenching).

Rams are offered for sale for the first time at 14 months old in September, when our on-property ram sale is held, and privately at any time thereafter. They are offered with wool and muscle scan tests taken at around twelve months old (mid-August).

We would like to thank all bidders and purchasers at our 2023 auction, where these purely paddock run rams sold to \$3400, and averaged \$1564, which represented great value for both parties.

Seven-month-old ram lambs will be displayed at the 2024 Burra Expo, as well as a selection of 18 month old rams, plus Stud ewes running with sires at that time.

We will have a display on-property at Waterloo on Wednesday 28th February 2024, and look forward to catching up with all interested breeders then, and in the year ahead, including the Mid North Inspection Day on Monday 26 August 2024.

In 2023, the 15th annual on-property sale at Tintinara achieved a top of \$8,500 to the T&S Stud from Sherlock, SA, with an average of \$2528 and a total clearance. Hamilton Run bred Rams were offered as part of both the Tintinara and Saddleworth sales, achieving a total clearance.

In total, 345 rams were sold by auction this season across the two properties sales, validating the demand for the stud's genetics.

The purchase of Moorundie 001 for \$50,000 was a major highlight for the 2023 season. Purchased in conjunction with Collinsville, we see this sire further enhancing our breeding objectives of strong constitution and width of body. This sire has been used heavily in this year's Al program.

This year's drop of ram lambs are showing great growth for age, with bright white wools on a meaty carcass. We continue our efforts using DNA genetic testing to improve our data accuracies and introduce industry leading genetics to progress ASBV's moving forward.

ASBVs will be available on sale rams this selling season.

RIDGWAY

Based at Lameroo in the southern Mallee region of South Australia, Ridgway Stud is run by Ric, Gail, Matthew, and Rachel Ridgway.

The stud's continued selection for animals which are plain bodied and early maturing, carrying fast growing, elite fibre with good density sees it widely recognised as producing a genuine dual purpose Merino.

For more than a decade, Ridgway has used Merino Select ASBVs as a tool to assist with their selection and mating decisions. This, together with strict visual assessment, has resulted in them producing Merinos that are both consistent and predictable. Selection for animals that have positive ASBVs for fat, eve muscle and early growth has resulted in lambs that reach marketable weights a lot earlier, giving clients the option to join ewe lambs if required.

The Ridgway flock is shorn every six months with their ewes producing between 4 and 5 kilograms of 18 to 19 micron fleeces, ranging from 60 to 75 millimetres in length, which is in line with most



The 2023 program has produced some exciting sons from Ella Matta 210083, Wallaloo Park 226 and Glenlea Park 210244.

We are excited with the prospects from the joining of our own sires such as Wirrilla Run 220341, with several in the industry's top 5 per cent, 10 per cent and 20 per cent for Yearling Weight (YWT), Eye Muscle Depth (EMD), Yearling & Adult Clean Fleece Weight (YCFW & ACFW) and Staple Length (YSL).

2024 sires include Ridgway Poll 220531 (Classing's Classic \$8500). Kelvale 221290 (on-property), Glenlea Park 545 and 244 (purchased 2022) and Wirrilla Run 220341.

The Mullighan family have been farming and breeding their own Merinos in the Hilltown/ Andrews district in the Mid North of South Australia, since 1950. Over the last few years, we have adopted eID tags and purchased the BreedElite Auto Drafter and fleece weighing systems. This has refined our classing immeasurably. Although not selecting for micron which has been 18 to 18.5, it has dropped to around 17.5 while fleece weights have increased, above 7kg per head per year. Shearing occurs every 6 months. Eve muscle and fat are in the top percentile. Scanning ewes in lamb are consistently 150 to 165 per cent each year.

Recently we purchased two rams from Well Gully Stud, in Mitchell, Queensland, a harsh environment with hot humid summers. These have produced terrific offspring, and we also have semen in store for purchase.

We are very much enjoying and getting a lot of satisfaction from what we have achieved with our stud merinos. Although we are not seeking a high profile, we welcome all enquiries and inspections.

SIRE EVALUATION TRIAL



fter the inability to find a suitable host site for the 2023 drop, we are starting to gain momentum again. Turrettfield Research Centre has kindly nominated for the 2024 and 2025 drop. This is exciting news for us as they are keen to host the field days and displays, with the goal of expanding into something bigger. It does mean that it is a smaller trial with only 600 ewes available, however this is sufficient to give diversity.

The AI program was completed in December with ten participants, including two link sires. Six of the participants are local SA Studs, along with one from WA, one from Tasmania and the two link sires are from NSW and Victoria.

The ewe base is predominantly Mernowie/ Leahcim blood, so they are plain productive type ewes. The SAMSET committee is looking forward to working with the Turrettfield team.

Meanwhile the 2022 drop trial is heading towards the final stages. The trial has been held at David Eckert's family farm, Mentara Park. The progeny dropped in early May 2022 with a great lambing of 136% lambs marked from the 16 sires participating.

Data collected along the way included weaning weights in August 2022, carcase scanning in March 2023 then a visual classing and mid side samples taken in early June 2023. SAMSET then hosted a very successful field day on the 23rd of June. It was a great day to see the individual progeny drafted to be compared.

The second shearing was then completed, the week following the field day. Wool weights were taken and skins were scored post shearing. The wether portion of the drop were then sold in July with Meat Eating Quality Traits taken on an allocated portion.

An analysis of the data that has been taken so far can be found on the AMSEA website under the SA Evaluation Trail.

In approximately February 2024 it is anticipated that the final data recording on the 2022 drop ewes will be taken. A Micron test, visual



classing, shearing, wool and animal weights will all be included.

This will mark the end of the 2022 drop and Mentara Park's involvement.

David Eckert and his family need to be congratulated on the way they have hosted the trial over two consecutive drops. The presentation of the sheep and their willingness to help has been fantastic and we thank them for their support of the SA Sire Evaluation Trial.

BIOLOGICAL SHEARING A VIABLE ALTERNATIVE

n the search for an alternative to traditional shearing, Australian Wool Innovation (AWI) and the University of Adelaide have joined forces.

The \$1.4 million project has found a protein from the corn plant called zein, which, when injected into the sheep, produces a break in the fibre. This weakened zone enables harvesting but the fleece will remain on the sheep without the need for a net.

Chief researcher, Professor Phil Hynd of the University of Adelaide, says that the new project takes a biological approach that is different from earlier methods.

"Previous attempts at biological wool harvesting concentrated on temporarily stopping wool growth, which resulted in fleece shedding," Professor Hynd said.

"In contrast, the new approach is aimed at creating a weakened zone of wool next to the sheep's skin, which enables the fleece to stay on the sheep for several weeks.

"Wool will continue to grow beneath the weak point, so as to protect the sheep from hypothermia and sunburn after the fleece is harvested. You can harvest the treated wool from two to ten weeks after treatment".

The treated wool has a staple strength of less than 10N/kTex.

"While each staple is weak, when combined with others, the total force to break them is relatively high. This is very important because it means that we can now aim treatments to reduce staple strengths to very low levels which will ensure that all treated sheep are harvestable," Professor Hynd said.

A trial has already been undertaken by the University of Adelaide. That trial found that the fleece did not fall off in the paddock under normal grazing conditions for up to ten weeks after the treatment was administered.

The project is looking at administering the treatment via an injection, rather than via feeding, where there are the problems of uneven consumption and differences in gut function.



"We are working on a subcutaneous injectable and we believe that we should be able to dial up quite accurately the N/KTex that we require. The injected dose would be based on body weight, in a similar manner to how doses are calculated for drenching," Professor Hynd said.

The protein injecting system will need to be approved by the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority.

The researchers are now refining the method for harvesting the wool.

"We developed with AWI, some time ago, a hand-held machine which peels the wool off like an orange peel and it doesn't need any skill to operate," Professor Hynd said.

Once the prototype harvester was developed, further work on it was put on hold until the protein was shown to weaken the fibre.

Now that the process to weaken the wool is predictable and consistent, research into developing a harvesting system is in full swing. In the long term, Professor Hynd wants to see a fully automated system that peels the wool off, with sheep moving on conveyor belts and a vacuum picking up the wool and classing it automatically. AWI is seeking proposals to develop mechanical or automated solutions to harvest weakened wool from engineers and researchers.



Dr Sarah Weaver, part of the team of researchers from the University of Adelaide.


Compared to traditional shearing, biological wool harvesting will improve wool quality by eliminating skin pieces and second cuts. Health and safety issues around the use of sharp handpieces would be eliminated and an automated system may reduce handling injuries.

AWI Chair Jock Laurie explained that the biological harvesting project is very timely, and has the potential to be a game changer for wool harvesting.

"It is critically important for the industry because we need to provide growers with new harvesting options. Times of pressure in industries drive change and that is exactly where we are with the wool industry right now," Mr Laurie said.

"We have seen enough potential in this project so far to believe it provides a great opportunity for the industry. At this stage, I can say it is very positive and I hope this gives confidence to the industry that AWI will continue to drive and invest in this work.

"It might not be for everyone, but we need to provide choices for woolgrowers about how they remove their wool efficiently and safely."


