

FOREWORD

There were 30 Merino studs from SA listed in the first national register of Stud Merino Flocks. The formation of the South Australian Stud Merino Sheepbreeders' Association occurred in September 1922, with the objectives of 'promoting the pastoral industry of South

Australia, encourage the breeding of fine Merino sheep and to compile a register of the stud Merino flocks of the state'.

The first national 'Flock Book Register' was issued in July 1923 and included information about the foundation of the flock, the breeding of rams used and data on flock numbers for the previous year.

The 1922 publication also included a breeder supplement where stud owners could publish images and illustrations of their flocks.

A century later, the 2022 SA Stud Merino Annual Directory captures the 125 currently registered

Merino & Poll Merino studs in the state, where colour photos highlight the genetic development of the breed and many studs describe their history and objectives to the benefit of the sheep producer.

An objective of the Association continues:

'To promote and encourage the breeding and improvement of pure Merino and Poll Merino sheep in Australia'.

Merino SA acknowledges the stud breeders who have sought to improve both Association and industry over many years and encourages the reader to engage with the current breeders listed within.

A special section in this Annual provides snippets from the past and preludes a commemorative Centenary book to be launched in September.

We may look back, but we are really looking forward.





CHANGES AND CHALLENGES PRESIDENT'S REPORT

elcome to the 2022 SA Stud Merino Annual Directory. We hope you enjoy this special edition and feel confident in adding more SA Merinos to your breeding program.

The weather this year was a mixed bag and it was generally a late break to the season in most areas, with reasonable follow-up rain in some areas. It was great to see most of the pastoral areas receiving some good rains, with inside cropping country being good to excellent.

South Australia was very fortunate to host two sheep exhibitions and sheep judging competitions in 2021 – the SA Merino Expo in March at Burra, while a new Pre-Sale Expo was held at Jamestown in August. Both of these events were very successful and congratulations to the organisers and competitions winners. Another highlight of the year was the successful School Merino Wethers competition, which still managed to run despite the disappointing late cancellation of the Royal Adelaide Show. It was a credit to all involved and we thank RAS for their commitment to this competition.

Covid-19 also had an impact on event visitor numbers and forced the cancellation of a couple of key shows. Due to border closures, no interstate studs or visitors could attend the Adelaide Ram Sale at Wayville. The sale was still very successful, with the top price ram selling to \$56,000 and the sale averaging an impressive \$10,277. Onproperty sales were also outstanding, with many studs achieving record averages. Congratulations to all studs and especially to the buyers and underbidders for your support and confidence in the Merino industry.

Wool prices are reasonably strong with the EMI at 1389c – this is about 190c up at the same time last year and 530 c/kg about 18 months ago. Generally, all sale sheep have enjoyed good prices with most stock in good to very good condition.

On a national level, South Australia remains keen to be a part of a national body representative of Merino sheepbreeders.

2022 marks 100 years of the SA Stud Merino Sheepbreeders' Association, with a commemorative book underway to celebrate this special anniversary. It is planned the coffee-table style book will be released at the Royal Adelaide Show in September. Thank you to all involved in this project.

Our Executive officer, Jen Light has been a key driver for this Annual publication, the Centenary Book as well as our Association overall. We

Thanks to all the Management Committee for their input and dedication to the affairs of the Association and industry over the past 12 months.



MARGIE TROWBRIDGE AN ELITE FOCUS



here would hardly be a stud Merino breeder who hasn't used some form of artificial breeding in their genetic improvement program. The ability to use top sires and elite ewes has enhanced Merino profit drivers in many flocks. These technologies have been pivotal in sharing genetics and replicating superior animals.

Margie Trowbridge has been peering down a laparoscope for 35 years now and in that time has inseminated thousands of ewes and been a big part of producing industry leading rams and ewes. She is recognised both locally and internationally as a leading exponent of the craft. Most elite rams bred in South Australia pay a visit to Brecon Breeders for semen collection.

Margie grew up near Willunga on her family's property. They ran a vineyard as well as a successful Murray Grey cattle stud. Growing up amongst elite animals helped develop Margie's interest in genetics. On leaving school Margie trained as a vet at Melbourne University where she completed her Bachelor of Veterinary Science in 1984.

Margie never worked in general practice because her passion was for elite animals so she started working for Ag Tech Artificial Breeding based at Mount Barker. Taught by Tim Heath, Margie soon realised that this work was for her. On the dissolution of Ag Tech, Margie and Tim formed Master Breed and continued their work with cattle.

During this time Margie met Bill Trowbridge and she married and moved to Keith in the South East with Bill in 1987. Their business, Brecon Breeders, started in 1989 and with the assistance of John Grainger, an early South Australian exponent, Margie learnt to inseminate sheep. In exchange for this information, Margie taught John the skills around embryo transfer.

The Al centre was built on their property 'Caraby' and it has facilities for semen collection, quarantine and embryo transfer. Currently the Al centre can house up to forty rams and two hundred ewes.

Early clients included Neil McLennan from the famous Banavie Stud in Victoria and well known local Keith studs, Warrawee Park and Flairdale, run by the Allen and Lehmann families. In the first year, Margie and Bill inseminated around one thousand ewes for their clients.

The business has grown to the stage where they now inseminate tens of thousands of ewes and harvest hundreds of donor ewes for embryos each year.

Like all strong businesses, Brecon Breeders has employed many young people. They help with, amongst other things, semen collection, distribution of Al packages and assisting on the road. These opportunities enable keen employees to learn both from Bill and Margie as well as from leading breeders.

Running Brecon Breeders certainly involves a high degree of professionalism and cooperation with breeders to enable the exacting programs to happen. In a seven month hectic season, there is no time for sick days or last minute changes as protocols are started seventeen days in advance of insemination.



Much of Margie's work is based in South. Australia and Victoria, whilst pre-covid there was an annual trip to New Zealand. A highlight for Bill and Margie has been their overseas work in Argentina and Chile. Not only did they inseminate ewes in South America, but they left a lasting legacy by training local vets in artificial breeding techniques. This has enabled the breeders in these countries to use both their own and Australian genetics to improve animals on a continual basis.

One of the things that Bill and Margie enjoy has been their long term work with clients. "It has been terrific to see the children of some of our early clients now running the breeding programs," says Margie. "The mums and dads are taking a secondary role whilst the children are making decisions."

These long term relations show that there is strong client satisfaction and a trust that all businesses rely on.

The Australian Merino Breeders certainly appreciate the great work done by Brecon Breeders and we hope that Margie and Bill can continue to be such a vibrant part of our industry.

SCHOOL WETHER COMPETITION A VALUED EVENT

he School Merino Wether competition continues to go from strength to strength every year. Even with Covid-19 affecting the event there are still new schools and people wanting to be involved.

Due to the late cancellation of the Royal Adelaide Show, Merino SA was concerned that the competition may not be allowed to run at the showgrounds. However, with huge support from the RAHS we were very relieved and thankful to be able to utilise the fantastic facilities in the Stud Sheep Pavilion again,

There were many restrictions with social distancing, masks required to be worn at all times in the shed, schools only allowed one participant per sheep plus two teachers or helpers, check-ins at the door and only one entry door and one exit door.

All students and teachers were fantastic at conforming to the Covid-19 rules and everyone accepted the situation and were grateful the event was simply able to be held.

The school's strong participation was indicated by the eventual 70 teams of 3 wethers from 38 schools, three of them being new to the competition. More schools had expressed a desire to participate, but the uncertainty and restrictions of the time forced withdrawals throughout the year. Well done to all the schools that made it to Adelaide to compete in September.

Teachers have relayed how they have integrated the Merino wethers as part of the school curriculum, to not only educate the participating students but all agricultural students throughout the year. The animals have become a great resource for teaching.

The competition was run in a very similar format as previous years. The wethers arrived and were penned, weighed and muscle-scanned on Tuesday afternoon before being prepared for judging on presentation on

Wednesday morning. Due to the number of teams this was done in small heats of about 9 pens of three, so the judges can assess the students for their handling skills as well. A final of the best presented pens was held at about 11am for the top point winners of the heats. This gives judge Luke Schreiber, from Spence Dix and Co at Keith, the opportunity to put the best pens together and present the winners. Luke explains his decision to all participants and teachers to help educate them on what he is looking for.

Shearing began at about 9am and continued throughout the day, finishing at about 2:30pm. There were six shearers organised by SCAA Shearing Training Inc co-ordinator Glenn Haynes, who gets on the microphone to give information to the teachers and students about shearing and wool handling. The wool was then individually weighed and valued by Australian Wool Network's Jared Philips.

At 3pm the final of the Class Handlers competition of 14 participants took place. During the pens presentation judging earlier in the day the overjudges, Anthony Hurst and John Daniell were assessing the students for how well they handled the wethers. The participants standards have certainly improved over the years of the competition.

While this is going on in the shed, behind the scenes all the data and scores are collated by Merino SA's Executive Officer, in preparation for the presentation of the major awards later in the day. Jen's efforts for the Merino Wether Competition have certainly been appreciated.

There are many individuals and organisations that contribute to the success of the event, with sincere thanks expressed to our judges, the stewards, shearers and wool handlers. Many sponsors have been with the competition since inception and we thank and acknowledge AWI, RAHS and the many studbreeders for their support with this program.

The long days are very rewarding, watching the students participate and learn about different facets of the Merino industry. Competition is strong, and while achieving a place ribbon is the goal, the schools and students gain a greater prize of increased skill and understanding. We hope this provides them with opportunities in their future careers, and a desire to return to the competition again this year.





MERINO EXPERIENCE **SCHOLARSHIP WINNER**

oming from a sheep property in the State's South East, 2021 SA Sheep Expo participant Ben Frick was already familiar with many aspects of sheep handling and showed a genuine desire to learn more. Impressing the judges and stewards at the April Expo, Ben was the successful winner of the Merino SA 'Merino Experience Award' - a week-long farm stay at a selected SA Merino stud.

October school holidays proved perfect timing for the on-farm experience, selected by Ben to be at the Old Ashrose property of Nick and Kate Wadlow, Hallett. *It was a lifechanging experience," said Ben. "I encourage all young people to attend the SA Sheep Expo and apply for the scholarship."

With October a traditionally busy month onfarm, Ben had the opportunity to be involved with the shearing, crutching and sorting rams at Old Ashrose, with off-farm visits to the Mt Bryan All centre and the studs of East Bungaree and Collinsville.

"I spent the first morning helping with penning up mobs for shearing. I also got to visit the Al Centre where I learnt about collecting and freezing semen, and then thawing and checking the quality of samples. Later in the day, I got a full farm tour of Collinsville, looking at the ewes and checking out the new flash ram shed and sheep yards. I really enjoyed learning about the importance of the structure of the sheep to ensure longevity and how the sheep have the ability to do well on hill country with natural pastures," enthused Ben.

"The next days it was back at Old Ashrose, helping move sheep and bringing in mobs for shearing, as well as classing rams for sale. These are shorn prior to sale into the northern pastoral country. A lesson I learnt, was the importance of wool nourishment, meaning the wool will be better yielding. I was also helping in the sheep yards backlining and vaccinating. We moved mobs from the ram shed up to the shearing shed. I even got to be part of selecting

fleeces for the show, this involved selecting the rams and ewes from the ram shed, and then transporting them up to the shed to get shorn. These fleeces then get entered into Royal Shows around Australia.

"Later in the week I was fortunate enough to jump on the handpiece and help out with the crutching. In the afternoon we were back busy shifting and sorting mobs. We had to select some rams for delivery the next day. We loaded these up early and headed off."

Nick Wadlow, stud principal, spoke highly of Ben's attitude and capabilities "Ben is such a great kid, brilliant. We've been very fortunate to have him stay with us, he's like part of the family now and he is welcome to come back and help out anytime. We've been really fortunate - we hosted Ella Jones, the first Scholarship winner, and she was fantastic too"

Ben reflected on his Merino experience, "This scholarship helped me learn more about the different types of sheep that are run in the different pastoral areas. I learnt more about the style of sheep in the Mid North, they are bigger framed and heavier cutting, with a medium type of wool. I also learnt more about the breeding of Merinos and Poll Merinos and how the genetics influence the horns. This experience has helped further ignite my passion for the agriculture industry with a main focus on sheep farming."

Merino SA congratulates all involved in this program and join Ben in thanking the Wadlow family and Jen & Tony Brooks for passing on their knowledge and advice over the course of the 2021 farm-stay. We hope it provides a pathway to new and positive experiences with Merinos in the future.







WONDERFUL OPPORTUNITY PANDY FILMS

hen Andrew 'Pandy' Morphett lost his casual job at an audio-visual company due to Coronavirusinduced business restrictions in 2020, it was a SA Stud Merino Sheepbreeder who offered an unexpected pathway.

Pandy had been sharing cooking videos on social media, keeping friends and family entertained through the uncertain times of lockdown. The videos were seen by relative David Woodard, Woolporinna Merinos at Eden Valley, who suggested Pandy's film-making skills could be put to good use recording stud rams for sale presentation.

"Never did I think sharing cooking videos on social media would land me a dream job filming in an industry I was raised in," said Pandy. "Coronavirus has impacted the world in many negative ways. In my case, it created a wonderful opportunity."

Growing up on a sheep and cattle station in the state's far north paired well with Pandy's passion of film making. "They say, 'never work with children or animals' – I say, 'hold my beer'," laughed Pandy.

lan Koch, Bunyara Merino & Poll Merinos at Moculta was Pandy's first client. It was a learning curve for both of them. "Pandy was great to work with", said lan, "He has a good knowledge of how animals behave, he's got that natural understanding. We filmed six weeks before our sale and had to create a facebook page so people could watch

the video. We were surprised at how many comments and the feedback we got, people watched it multiple times over that six weeks.'

The Bunyara video caught the eye of fellow studbreeder Ian Michael, Nyowee Poll Merinos. According to Pandy, Ian just asked "How soon can you get here?"

Both studs continued their relationship with Pandy Films through the 2021 ram sale season.

"We lined up our 2021 Adelaide team for Pandy to film, our number one ram was a pretty good ram, and was first up in the filming," said lan Michael. "We filmed on a Friday and Pandy had a quick production turnaround, so on Sunday an interstate buyer had been able to see the video and confirmed interest in the ram. It is really exciting to have that feedback so quickly.

"Clients can really see all the good parts and the faults of the animal when Pandy slows the moving shot down," Ian added. "A really good ram just looks fantastic this way – showing movement, but not rushed."

Other studs and even stock agents have now included Pandy Films in their promotional strategies. After meeting Tony Wetherall, Elders Stud Stock agent at the Adelaide Ram Sale, Pandy was provided opportunities to expand his client network and experience further.

"In addition to Elders, I've now been doing work for cattle studs, SA Arid Lands Landscape Board and Meat & Livestock Australia," Pandy said. "My aim for any video I produce is to



keep the audience entertained. I enjoy creating videos to engage the audience, regardless of the topic. However, film school taught me to always know your target audience.

"For sheep studs, the main goal is to give potential buyers enough confidence to feel like they were inspecting the rams in person. My creative difference is the slow-motion walking shots."

Pandy Films is one SA business that was created out of adversity and Pandy's talent and easy-going nature has proven a winner with studbreeders as they seek to promote their sale teams. Filming rams has also been personally rewarding and provided unexpected opportunities for Pandy, who concluded "I love helping my clients in their success stories, I couldn't think of a better career."

Our breeding strategies are for a plain easy-care animal that is shorn at 6 monthly intervals with 80mm staple length coming with high fertility. We actively stopped mulesing 5 years ago with no negative effects on our flock and have clients following this more sustainable practice. Our ewe base averaged 6.5kg at 9 months growth and 18.5 micron for our October shearing which has been the norm for many years now.

Our clients have always been rewarded well for using our genetics. Back in October Warren (Bunk) Elson topped the Cleve off shears sale with \$344/ head for young ewes. In the same month Neil Byerlee of Carrieton marked 129% lambs across his whole flock and then in November Dave Foster of Louth Bay averaged a cool \$3,150/bale for 18 bales of wool sold!



IMPROVING THE SUCCESS OF SHEEP ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION PROGRAMS

A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE AWI LTD-FUNDED PROJECT



pregnancy rates from AI often ask why does it happen and will they improve. Poor semen quality/operator are often blamed but, from what we now know, this is highly unlikely to be the case. Rather, success or failure depends largely on the ability of the progesterone pessary (CIDR or sponge) to reliably synchronise the oestrous cycle. This might seem straightforward but we are dealing with a 17-day cycle with about 6% of ewes cycling on any one day. Furthermore, in Spring, there are two groups of sheep – cycling and non-cycling – and this presents another set of challenges.

Five years ago, researchers at Turretfield Research Centre together with support from MerinoSA convinced AWI Ltd that AI success rates could be improved once the secrets of the synchronised oestrous cycle were revealed. What really happens when a progesterone pessary is inserted - we know that it synchronises the cycle but what effect does it have on follicle development and conception rates? A key strategy in the study was the use of trans-rectal ultrasonography that enables the observation of ovarian activity on a regular basis. Many thousands of images have been collected together with observations on timing of cestrus and AI outcomes in approximately 3,000 ewes. The more important findings of the study are:

 Whilst pessaries are able to prevent oestrus, they are unable to suppress the formation of ovulatory follicles which can occur at any time. As a result, when pessaries are removed, the ovulatory follicles differ substantially in age and in their ability to produce oestrogen which is essential for synchrony.


- Age of the ovulatory follicle is also related to the ability of the ewe to conceive. The most fertile follicles are those that emerge mid-way through the pessary period. This is the "sweet spot" and the success of an Al program is determined, to a large extent, by the number of ewes with ovulatory follicles that emerge at this time.
- On top of all this, nutrition in Autumn plays a major role in determining both the pattern of oestrus and the ability of the ewe to conceive. High long term nutrition (BCS 4.0+; from the previous weaning) advances the onset of oestrus and improves both pregnancy rate and litter size. On the other hand, high short term nutrition (1.75 maintenance during the pessary period) improves pregnancy rate. A comparable study was not conducted in Spring when nutrition would be expected to play a lesser role.
- In addition, the progesterone profile during pessary treatment plays a significant role in determining the pattern of oestrus and pregnancy rate. Invariably, the pessary is unable to maintain the desired profile but replacing it on day 9 produces a later but nicely synchronised pattern of oestrus. Importantly, maintaining a high progesterone profile appears to override the effects of nutrition in Autumn. Hence, pessary

replacement has a role to play in minimising between-flock variability at this time of year albeit at an additional cost.

One of the problems in collecting data of this nature, particularly on the occurrence of oestrus, is the need to make observations during the night. Recording teaser marks between midnight and 6 a.m. can be challenging but the information gathered has proven invaluable in understanding the relationship between follicle development and timing of oestrus. In these studies, ewes that came into oestrus during this period were the stragglers and it was in these ewes that we first realised that an association exists between size of ovulatory follicles, oestrogen levels and timing of oestrus.

One of the main goals of this research was to develop improved treatment protocols for synchrony of oestrus. The ultrasound observations provided the clues for two new options.

 Firstly, ewes in which ovulatory follicles emerge during days 7 - 9 of the pessary period (the "sweet spot") are the most fertile. Time of emergence can be controlled by treatment with prostaglandin (PGF2a), a hormone that causes most ewes to ovulate, thus resetting the ovarian "clock".
 Treatment needs to occur 27 days before pessary insertion and, whilst this might

seem strange, it ultimately results in the emergence of the ovulatory follicle at the desired time. The Turretfield results indicate that if this treatment is included in the conventional protocol, the lambing percentage is improved by about 30%. This treatment is only effective in cycling ewes. and, consequently, is much less effective in Spring.

· Secondly, ewes in which ovulatory follicles emerge late (i.e. after the "sweet spot") are the least fertile. These follicles are relatively immature and need to be exposed to PMSG . During the breeding season (Autumn), 12h earlier than normal. This improves synchrony and the Turretfield results show an increase in lambing percentage of about 17%. A negative is that PMSG needs to be administered around mid-night in ewes treated with CIDRs (assuming removal at noon with insemination commencing from 8 a.m. on the appropriate day). On the other hand, in ewes treated with sponges, PMSG can be given at 10 p.m. (assuming removal at 10 a.m. with insemination commencing from 8 a.m. on the appropriate day).

The PGF2a treatment is not expensive (around \$3 per head) and there is no additional expense with early PMSG treatment although a short night-shift is requires if CIDAs are used. Some inconvenience is incurred with the additional handling of stock in each case. Both

of these new protocols are to be evaluated

Given these findings, what are the practical strategies that can be adopted from this


- . Use one or both of these protocols. depending on time of year. With CIDRs, insemination needs to start from about 43 -44h after removal of CIDRs. With sponges, insemination from about 46h after removal is anticipated to be the best option.
- maintain a high level of nutrition from the previous weaning and/or during the pessary period. High nutrition will require insemination to start from 43 - 44h after pessary removal. With poor nutrition, oestrus will probably be delayed and this will require a later insemination (e.g. no earlier than 48h after pessary removal).
- . Pessaries can be replaced on day 9 to give a better progesterone profile. This will result in a later but nicely synchronised oestrus that necessitates insemination starting about 48h after pessary removal. This option has not been examined in conjunction with either of the new protocols.
- . There needs to be flexibility in the timing of insemination given the substantial variation that exists in the patterns of oestrus.

Nutrition, progesterone profiles and the improved protocols can all influence timing, This situation is exacerbated by a lack of awareness that sheep treated with CIDRs ovulate about 6h earlier than sheep treated with sponges.

In addition, other strategies to improve the success of Al program are summarised in an online document. These include the use of teasers, how to best use teaser marks, the value of culling dry ewes and avoiding grazing pastures with high nitrogen content. 
Dr Simon Walker

r Simon Walker is a humble man who has dedicated much of the past four decades exploring sheep reproduction issues for the benefit of the industry. Since his retirement, a lot of this work has been voluntary or with limited funding. He has crawled around Turretfield sheep pens at 3.00am on cold winter's nights gathering data for his research into laparoscopic protocols and laboriously pored over information supplied from breeders regarding successes and failures in their artificial insemination [AI]

Until 2006, Dr Walker was Principal Scientist at Turretfield Research Centre, SARDI. His work included research into aspects of sheep embryology and he produced Australia's first cloned sheep - 'Matilda'. Much of his work led to international recognition for the Institute and his procedures.

The past 15 years has seen Simon Walker continuing to focus on how sheepbreeders can achieve a better result refining protocols with laparoscopic Al. He has examined ewe nutrition, embryo quality, oestrus and ovulation in detail, providing significant and thorough research to enable producers to improve their preparation of ewes ready for

This is research which can enhance the financial benefits for the breeder. Merino SA is grateful for Simon's dedication and expertise in continuing this research.

Each year they sell over 230 Poll Merino rams and this year's sale team are sired by Kamora Park 14 (stud reserve), Kamora Park 333 (sold to North Cowie for \$18,000), Kamora Park 525 (sold to Senior Park for \$18,000), Kamora Park 461 (sold to Brimanna Stud for \$14,000), Wallaloo Park 226 (purchased in partnership with Seymour Park for \$76,000), Seymour Park 111 Sons, Willandra 447 (purchased by Seymour Park for \$51,000), Gunallo 295 (semen share and sold for \$60,000), Gunallo 463 (sold for \$37,000) and Coromandel 419.

In 2022, Kamora Park will aim to display rams at the SA Stud Merino Expo in Burra, at the Australian Sheep and Wool Show in Bendigo and at the South East Field Day in Keith. They will also be attending the Royal Adelaide Show in Adelaide in September with some select rams to be offered in the Adelaide Ram Sale

The structure of the fleece is also a strong focus, to allow for high yielding wools and high fleece weights on uncomplicated bodies. Over the past three years our average wool results have been 19.0 - 20.0 micron, 8 - 9 kg fleece weight per head and 69 - 72% yield.

We will be attending field days at Keith, Murray Bridge, Bendigo and at Adelaide Show.

KELVALE

The Kelvale Poll Merino Stud was founded in 1966 by the Kellock family and is now managed by Stephen and Peta Kellock at Keith in the South East.

Today there are currently 1000 stud ewes that are mated to Kelvale bred sires with outside influence via AI and ET programs.

The main breeding objective of the stud is to produce a well-balanced animal for both wool and meat production. This is achieved by improving the density, length and quality of the wool grown on a highly productive animal, with high growth rates.

Kelvale are currently shearing every 6 months and obtaining testing lengths in excess of 70mm however our aim is to genetically breed the length to above 80mm consistently. Deep crimping and bold, white wools are grown with an average flock micron of 20.0.

Kelvale is actively involved in the collection and use of data for the Sheep Genetics ASBV program. The data is invaluable to continually evaluate and improve carcase traits, with positive fat and muscle of high importance for survivability of lambs. We enjoy the involvement in Sire Evaluation trails and have had great genetic results.

practice of mulesing to be phased out, no lambs have been mulesed since 2008. We have also increased our lambing percentage to be consistently over 110% from ewes mated with some mobs achieving over 130% in recent years. Kelvale are prepared to look outside the square to breed a highly

The stud is an entirely non-mulesed flock and mulesing ceased within our commercial ewe flock in 2007. Since ceasing mulesing we have not noticed any detrimental effects to question this decision.

Our breeding objectives include white, bright, medium wool on a structurally sound, easy care, dual-purpose frame. Our bloodline was founded on North Ashrose, since then we have introduced genetics from Moorundie Park, Glenlea Park, Roemahkita, Leahcim and Calcookara. In 2021 we returned to Roemahkita and added a son of Glenlea Park 'Smithy'.

We are focused on using MerinoSelect as an important sire buying tool, with the intent to head

down this path in our stud, as it provides us with objective information to assist in our breeding decisions along with physical assessment of wool and structural confirmation.

KIANDRA

Kiandra Poll Merino is located north of Bordertown, in the Upper SE of South Australia.

Fertility, phenotype, growth, constitution, pastern and foot structure, on a plain body animal form part of the foundation in our stud's selection process. We strive to maintain medium to fine. long stapled, well-nourished wools on a deep barrelled sheep to complement our other physical traits.

Objective measurement is at the heart of our

program with a strong emphasis on ASBV's especially muscle, fat, staple length, greasy fleece weight and number of lambs weaned to mention but a few.

In gathering our data we use pregnancy scanning for multiples and singles, as well as focusing on our flocks percentage of lambs weaned to ewes scanned. We record full pedigree of our elite ewes in the stud.

We offer our rams in early September by auction. Genomic results and ASBV's are available on all rams sold, with many in the top 5-10% across indexes and individual traits

Our stud flock is visually classed by Michael Elmes, Smart Stock.

We employee the services of neXtgen Agri for data management, sire selection and sheep breeding consulting.

LAMPATA

Lampata Poll Merino stud and family business, run by Bruce, Gaylia, Robert and Courtney Pocock, was first registered in 1982.

Lampata is based at Lameroo in the Southern Mallee of SA and is run in conjunction with their other farming enterprises, cropping and commercial sheep. Lampata Poll Merinos are ranked in the top 10% Dual Purpose index for sheep genetics. This result is from a random 10% of our ewe lamb flock taken September 2020 with Neogen DNA testing.

All sheep are paddock run and mated to give full and honest assessment under commercial conditions, just as is required in commercial clients' flocks.

Lampata's emphasis is on producing affordable and highly productive, plain-bodied, fertile and genuine dual-purpose rams for the commercial producer. Excellent returns are being made by their clients when selling wool or surplus stock.

Approximately 600 of their own surplus ewes are offered & highly sought at the annual Lameroo

Off Shears Sale, with many used to breed top lines of first cross ewes, particularly notable at the annual Naracoorte sales.

Lampata runs 1850 ewes, including 800 stud ewes. Their average flock micron is 20.5 for ewes and 19.5 for hoggets. They have stayed in this medium micron range to maximise overall productivity and profitability.

Their staple length allows for twice yearly shearings, which also gives management advantages.

They initially select 400 ram lambs each year, later reducing that to the top 200 visually, which are then widely assessed for fleece weight, micron, staple length, birth type, growth, fat and eye muscle.

Lampata sells rams at their annual on-property sale on the last Tuesday in August, and privately. The Pocock family invite anyone interested to inspect their sheep; they are an 'open book' and their door is always open. The Lampata website provides further information.

LEAHCIM

Leahcim increased the number of rams sold in 2021 to 300 at the annual on property, due to ongoing demand for our genetics. We will be offering 350 rams at our 2022 on-property auction of even superior quality.

Leahcim offers genetics that are of the highest level for measured quality, traceability and repeatability, with our customers future prosperity driving our breeding philosophies.

We have invested in data measurements through Sheep Genetics for over thirty years which has given us some of the most accurate and largest data bases in Australia. The addition of large numbers of follicle density measurements over the last four years to increase wool and skin quality and production will take Leahcim and our clients to the next level of advanced profitable and ethical breeding. Leahcim has also included Worm Resistance to its large number of traits collected.



2004 and with premiums for non-mulesed wools at \$1 to \$4 per kg and increasing, identifying genetics that can achieve non-mulesed status on a highly productive sheep has become very important.

Leahcim's data is available on the Sheep Genetics website and will be available on every sheep for sale in 2022. All Leahcim sheep are genomics tested for parentage identification and genotyped to maximise traceability and allow us to select for hard-to-measure traits, which will maximise our genetic gains.



At last year's EP Pre-Sale Expo at Wudinna, Mallee Hill gained fifth position up against some very good rams.

Good genetic gains are always being made in our flock. In 2021, we purchased Glenlea Park 121 for \$22,000 (19.0 mic, 99.6 cf, EMD 43.5mm) and Ridgway Advance 299 (18.9 mic, 100% cf, EMD 47mm). Emphasis is being placed on breeding a plainer animal and reducing our fibre diameter without any negative affect on fleece weight or growth/body weight.

Last year's sale topped at \$5,800, selling to long term clients LA and VA Hull. Sale average was \$1380. Rams also sold for \$600.

Lucernbrae is located in the Bremer Valley surrounded by rocky hills, north of Callington with an average rainfall of 370mm, Our family has been breeding Merino sheep for over 70 years.

The stud has concentrated on breeding Merino sheep that meet the ethical demand of producers and consumers who are now requiring sheep producers to address future expectations. We concentrate on breeding wrinkle free, plain-bodied sheep and ceased mulesing in 2007. Our aim is to breed elite sheep with soft, stylish white wool around 18.5 micron.

Current ewe hoggets tested in May are 17.5 micron. Adult ewes shorn in August 2021 are 18.3 microns. We shear twice yearly with maidens being shorn 3 times in 2 years. Comfort factor average is 99.5. The stud is Ovine Brucellosis and OJD accredited MN3. ASBV'S have proved that our sheep genetics are on par with other breeders in the sheep industry.

At Malleetech we use the Dual Purpose Plus index to rank our animals after visual traits have been assessed. This index targets production systems that require a balance of income from wool and meat production. The DP+ index includes reproduction, carcase traits and staple strength.


This production system is for self-replacing Merino flocks with a greater focus on lamb production, with a portion of the ewe flock mated to terminal sires to generate crossbred lambs for meat production. This means that there is greater emphasis on growth, carcase performance and reproduction to capitalise on the high value of lambs and to ensure that flock size is sustainable while joining to terminal sires. Wool production is still important, but the balance is on increasing fleece weight while trying to limit change in fibre diameter and staple strength.

Malleetech ASBV's are often trait leaders with positive EMD and backfat, Most rams sold are in the top 10% of Australia for the DP+ Index.

Malleetech sheep are bred tough to perform in Mallee conditions and perform well with minimal hand feeding.

The South Australian Stud Merino Sheepbreeders' Association was formed on Thursday, September 14, 1922 at the office of the Stockowners Association, Kalimna Chambers, Adelaide.

A committee of 7 was elected with Alick J Murray nominated as President. It was noted that the committee of management was not to exceed nine and that they will have the power to deal with all South Australian entries in the newly established national Flock Register.

The following year, W G Hawkes was elected President, a role he held until 1935. From 1938, Presidents were elected for a two-year term. E D H Virgo, of the Stockowners Association, remained as Secretary of the Stud Merino Sheepbreeders Association from 1922 to 1939.

In 1948, the Management committee increased to 12, with the number of registered Merino studs having increased from 30 at inception to 123.

The first Life Member Award was presented to G. Stanley Hawker in 1974, recognising his service to the industry and involvement in the Management Committee since 1929.

Fifteen Life Memberships have been awarded in the history of the Association with an additional thirteen Service Awards presented from 2007 to 2018.

Stud membership reached a peak of 361 in 1967, after which many studs resigned their Merino interests to concentrate on Poll Merinos. Membership as at January 2022 comprises 125 studs, of which 32 are Merino and 93 are Poll Merino studs.

The SA Stud Merino Sheepbreeders Association became incorporated in November 1979 and uses the name Merino SA as an easier reference.



The railway line at Terowie played a key role in the proliferation of early studs in the Mid North region. Access to transport for wool and livestock was critical.

Horse drawn carts loaded with wool are classic scenes of the unmotorised era, with barges and paddlesteamers on the River Murray an alternate route for producers of the day.

With the proliferation of cars and trucks in the mid part of the century, sheep growing areas expanded.

Some weight and height restrictions on loads have been implemented in later years.

Before on-property sales proliferated, the Merino ram sales in Adelaide attracted hundreds of rams and took two days to complete.

Port Adelaide was the early venue for the Merino ram sales until they were transferred to the Royal Adelaide Showgrounds in 1925. Access to the railway line permitted sheep to be transported and unloaded easily. Sales were held in the 'fine, capacious new pavilion' of Goldsborough Mort & Co Ltd. The Elders Smith & Co Stud Sales Pavilion was

erected in 1933.

During the war years 1944-46, the location of the ram sale shifted from the Showgrounds to the abattoirs at Gepps Cross. Straw was put down in pig pens to accommodate the rams.

In 1947 the sales returned to the Showground, with world record ram sale prices making headlines through the 70s and 80s. The highest price for a Merino ram remains at \$450,000 which was paid for a Collinsville ram in Adelaide, Sep 1989.

An upgrade of the Dalgety Bennett Farmers Pavilion in 1992 formed a link to the Elders Pavilion and created a better sales environment.

The Adelaide Ram Sale moved to the Stud Sheep Pavilion in 2001 to be closer to the Merino sheep exhibits presented at the Royal Adelaide Show. It remains a single day sale on the Friday of Show week, with the highest sale average for any multivendor stud sheep sale in Australia.







nce described by the Hon Stanley M Bruce, then Prime Minister of Australia, as the "finest collection of Merino" photos to be seen," the Pascoe Collection reflects the pride of the early Merino breeders of South Australia.

While many photos are now on display in the Burra Town Hall, the original collection graced the well-lit walls of a local hairdressing salon, owned by Mr. Richard D. Pascoe. After one breeder, Mr L. M. Gebhardt, 'Mokota', gave Mr Pascoe a framed photograph to display in 1910, other breeders soon followed. The collection soon grew to over 129 photos of different stud ewes and rams which depicted some of the best sheep from the Mid North region of SA.

Prize winners and valuable stud rams were given the honour of being photographed and framed, with the public nature of the hairdressing salon providing good exposure for the breeder.

After the closure of the salon in 1961, the collection was dispersed. SA Stud Merino Sheepbreeders' Association secured a number of photographs, most of which have since been restored and were placed in the care of the Burra Art Gallery in 1994, then to the National Trust, Burra branch. The collection transferred on permanent loan to the Burra Cultural Centre Committee in January 2002, who initiated the collection's display at the Burra Town Hall.

Women have been involved with the care and breeding of Merinos since introduction.

If it wasn't for the interest and expertise of Elizabeth Macarthur, who was more involved with the development of the historic NSW 'Camden Park' flock than her often absent husband John, many of the early studs of SA may have had a poorer selection of sheep for their foundation.


and Merino studs were registered by women in their own right from 1926.

The 'Springfield and Wyeroo' flock had been in the Mt Crawford region since the 1850s and was inherited by Mrs M Warren in 1919 following the death of John Warren. It was Mrs M Warren who registered the 'Springfield and Wyeroo' Merino stud in 1926.

Later, in 1933, Mrs E M McIntyre formed the 'Iron Knob' Merino stud at Dawesley, registering the flock in 1936. Mrs E M Sawers followed a year later with the 'Haldane' Merino stud at Hallett.

'Summit View', 'Macaw Creek', 'Narmane' and 'Carousel' were among the South Australian studs registered before 1960 by ladies.

Mrs P L Puckridge had been involved in the 'White River' Stud




with her husband since 1956, taking over the management upon his death in 1974. She continued the purchase of rams from the Collinsville stud, until selling 'White River' in 1979 and commencing a new stud 'Partout' in 1980.

Jo Gebhardt's family had a long history with Merinos, commencing the Barton Hill flock in 1925. She credits her grandfather, Kelvin Dunn, for inspiring her to continue the work at Barton Hill, returning to the farm after completing University in Adelaide. "He was a very good sheep man," Jo said, "He was my inspiration, and the Merinos turned into my niche".

Jo took over Barton Hill in the early '90s, managing the stud until 2016. "I really enjoyed working with the rams while running

the stud," Jo said recently, "but I have been able to continue my interest in the Merino industry running a commercial flock."

Orrie Cowie's Heather
Dalla continues to be an
inspiration to many young
people looking to get
involved in the industry. Her
commitment to programs
such as the SA Sheep
Expo and School Merino
Wethers Competition
is driven by her belief in



education and passion for Merinos. Heather was the first female Management Committee member in the Association in 2006. Always hands-on, with a lifetime of experience, Heather now runs the Orrie Cowie Merino and Poll Merino studs with her son John.

Leonie Mills also grew up around Merinos, taking over from her father Alex Horne as studmaster and owner of Morley Poll Merinos, based at Cleve. Producing about 400 rams annually, Leonie is a regular exhibitor at the Eyre Peninsula and Burra Expos. As the first female Treasurer for the Association, Leonie is very much involved in the Management Committee and subcommittees in addition to her stud breeding program.

These examples of women contributing to the Association and Merino industry are a simple nod to all the ladies who have been, or are currently, working independently or alongside their partners to breed quality, healthy Merinos.

STUDBREEDERS vs STOCK AGENTS



Stud Merino Sheepbreeders had played cricket matches against the British Sheepbreeders Association since 1929, but in 1936 a match was arranged between the victors (Merino breeders) and the Stock Salesman's Association at the Adelaide Oval. 70 years later matches were still being played, with competitions extended to bowls and tennis.

The Adelaide Oval, University Oval, Clare Oval and Walkerville were some of the venues for various competitions, where – resplendent in whites – players enjoyed time out from farm or stockwork to socialise on and off the field.

Cricket teams evolved through the decades with generations of Collins's, Ashbys, Vandeleurs, Lehmanns, Murrays and Thomas's participating. J T Murray was a former international cricketer who made plenty of runs for the Association in 1936. Murray Thomas racked up a match participation rate of 25 / 25 in 1953, the only player to compete in every yearly game. Later, B T M Ashby showed strong form, sometimes referred to as "Mr Cricket".

The Cricket Scoring book provides insights from matches held from 1958 to 2007, plenty of ducks, only a couple over the century, and a few blank pages ready for the next challenge.



ACCELERA YOUR PRODUCTIVITY USING ASE



Australian Sheep Breeding Values (ASBVs) are an important tool to assist Merino producers in accelerating productivity using genetics.

MERINOSELECT Development Officer, Chloe Bunter, explains that ASBVs allow producers to select for and improve key production traits such as fleece weight while putting pressure on important health and welfare traits.

"ASBVs describe an animal's genetic merit for different traits by accounting for the non-genetic factors that influence performance," Chloe said.

"This includes how the animal has been fed, its age and whether it was born a single or twin. In this way, breeding values provide information on the genes that a ram or ewe will pass on to its progeny."

SELECT ASBVs

ienetics, a part of Meat & Livestock A (MLA), deliver the genetic evaluation for Australian Merino industry through Mb DSELECT. These MERINOSELECT ASI allow producers to compare and bent hark the genetic merit of animals from acks across Australia, to better inform selection and purchase decisions.

Selection indexes combine important ASBV traits into one number and are a useful way to rank animals quickly and easily. It's also important to consider the individual ASBVs that make up the index to ensure the animal meets your breeding objective, alongside structural and type assessment.

How are ram breeders using ASBVs?

ASBVs have given producers the power to influence traits such as eating quality, reproductive rate, growth, fleece and health characteristics, and manage the antagonistic relationships that exist between some of these traits.

Ram breeders contribute pedigree and

performance data on their flocks which is used alongside genetic parameters and genomic information to generate ASBVs. The information provided by breeders includes sire and/or dam, trait measurements and information on management.

For ram breeders, the most important tool to manage unfavourable relationships is to measure these traits

Merino breeders have shown that by measuring the traits of interest, they can manage these correlations, and make gains in important traits simultaneously.

A good example is the way Merino breeders have been able to manage the antagonistic relationship between breech wrinkle and fleece weight to make gains in both traits.

The figure depicts the MERINOSELECT average and trend for breech wrinkle and clean fleece weight ASBVs overtime. It shows the progress MERINOSELECT breeders have made in improving fleece weight (YCFW), while reducing breech wrinkle (EBWR), or breeding for a plainer breech.



For example, if regular drenching is required to manage worm burdens, your breeding objective may include reducing worm egg count (WEC) to genetically improve the worm burden of your flock, and reduce the costs to your production system.

Once you have identified the traits in your objective, you will identify where you currently sit for these traits. For ram breeders using MERINOSELECT, this will involve looking at average ASBVs for each drop, and genetic trends.

For commercial producers, genetic merit can be assessed through ram team tracking, or tools like Flock Profile, which provide an indication of the average genetic merit of the flock.

As the Merino industry is making gains over time, it's important to benchmark your flock against current industry, through the use of percentile band tables. This information allows you to set the desired direction and a set a target to achieve over the next five years.

DNA Testing - FAQs, answered by Neogen



mbarking on DNA testing for the first time might seem a daunting task but be assured it is an easy and affordable process that can deliver significant improvement in a flock through better selection at joining time.

What does DNA testing tell sheep

DNA testing is a fast and reliable way to read the genetic code that determines a sheep's performance and knowing the genetic merit of an animal at a younger age can guide selection and breeding decisions and shorten generation interval within your flock.

Where do you start?

The first step is to look at your breeding objective and identify what sort of DNA test is the best option for you. Having visually identified the pick of a drop, a DNA test can then be used to identify which animals to keep and which to cull from your breeding program.

For the Merino breed there are a few different tests you can select from GGP 50K, Poll, Parentage and Flock Profiling. The GGP 50K is the most popular as it feeds directly into the MerinoSelect system and allows breeders to get parentage and poll results all within the one test.

What if you are not a member of MerinoSelect?

While the GGP 50K is Neogen's most popular testing option for Merino breeders, for breeders not in MerinoSelect we can offer Parentage, Poll and Flock Profile testing.

Parentage testing is a popular choice amongst breeders who syndicate mate their animals or would like to elevate mothering up from their production system. DNA parentage is the most accurate way to identify full pedigree of an animal and allow your purchasers to buy with confidence. Poll/horn results are also available from a parentage test.

Flock Profile testing is the perfect way for flocks that are not part of the MerinoSelect database to get genomic breeding values that are scaled to the MerinoSelect ASBVs. This product is also a perfect way for commercial producers to benchmark their flock and use as a guide when purchasing rams to help reach their breeding objective quicker.

Is taking a DNA sample hard?

The short answer is no. To get started you will need an applicator and Tissue Sample Units (TSUs), these can be sourced from Neogen.

TSUs are designed so that each sample has its own vial and cutter which reduces the risk of sample contamination. Each TSU has its own unique ID that can be linked to the animal's ear tag, these can be easily recorded into on farm databases.

Neogen's lab will also accept samples as blood cards or semen samples.

What information do I get from a GGP 50K test?





Neogen's GGP 50K test results are combined with the physical measurements that you send through to MerinoSelect and become a part of your animals Australia Sheep Breeding Values (ASBVs). Genomic Breeding Values (ASBVs) are produced for critical traits including birth weight, weaning weight, post weaning weight, greasy fleece weight, fibre diameter, staple length, staple strength, early breach wrinkle, eye muscle depth, fat dept and carcase weight.

The GGP 50K test also reports on meat eating quality with values for lean meat yield, intramuscular fat and shear force these traits are otherwise impossible to measure without post-slaughter measurements.

What research is behind the GGP 50K test?

Neogen's GGP 50K test was developed with close collaboration with the former Cooperative Research Centre for Sheep Industry Innovation (Sheep CRC) and contains the top ovine SNPs (exclusive to Neogen). Research by Moghaddar et al (2019) has been shown that using the top SNPs increases prediction accuracies by 7-10% in both purebred and composite animals, when compared with conventional Ovine 50K tests which impute data.

How long does it take before you will see results?

We recommend allowing at least 1 week in postage before your samples are received at the Neogen office. Once your samples have been checked against the relevant paperwork and the invoice has been paid your samples will enter the laboratory. Results are usually received 3 to 4 weeks from the time the samples arrive at the laboratory. An additional one to two weeks should also be factored in for the results to be processed through the MerinoSelect analysis (data runs are conducted on the 7 and 21 of each month).

Results for GGP 50K tests will be reported by Sheep Genetics, if Parentage or Poll testing has been requested these results will be emailed to you by the Neogen SheepDNA office.

The SA entrants are Kelvale, Kiandra, Flairdale, Pepper Well, Baderloo, O'Brien, Malleetech and Roemahkita. From NSW entrants include The Yanko, Willandra and Lorelmo, while Forest Springs and Wallaloo Park are the two entrants from Victoria. Westwood Poll from WA completes the 4 state composition of the trial.

The two link sires are Mulloorie 'Elliot' 160059 from SA and Miramoona. 140012 from NSW.

Al for the 2022 Trial took place on December 15 & 16 and the ewes were in good score 4 condition - ideal for mating after a great spring.

The 2021 Trial had 560 lambs dropped, with tip-shearing done in September. The lambs grew out well in the spring.

The 2020 Trial at McPiggery is completed, sadly the planned field day had to be cancelled due to covid. All the results for the 2020 trial have been posted on the Merino SA and AMSEA websites.

Thanks must go to Duane Simon and the McMahon family for hosting the 2019 & 2020 trials.


Hopefully a field day at the Eckert property can happen in mid-June, permitting breeders to view the young sheep.

DOG FENCE UPDATE

MAKING A DIFFERENCE



t hasn't been an easy project to undertake. The challenges of remote locations, weather conditions, increased steel price, container shortages and delivery logistics have all hampered progress in the \$25 million investment to renew the Dog Fence. Running for 2150km, the construction of the South Australian Wild Dog Fence is expected to be completed by June 2024. Approximately 310km of fencing is complete, with 460km underway.

The 141km leg from Erudina to the NSW border is completed, and approvals have been completed for other sections of fence in the north-east pastoral area at Moolawatana (129km) and Wertaloona (70km).

The South Australian Department of Primary Industries and Region's Dog Fence Rebuild Manager, Lindell Andrews, said the first 26km stage at Erudina and Curnamona allowed for the trialling of the fence design, materials and actual costs. "It is a standard and flexible

design to fit our budget - 1.5m high, the posts are 7m apart, and the mesh has an attached 400mm lap,* Miss Andrews said.

In the Marree Local Dog Fence Board area, the 130km leg at Mundowdna is underway. Mulcorina (87km) is completed, and a realignment is proposed along Finniss Springs / Callanna boundary to avoid floodways.

The longest stage to date of 196km at Mt Eba / Millers Creek stretch is in progress, with a realignment through Millers Creek to move the fence out of many small but steep gullies.

Further west, the private section at Malbooma. (61km) requires a mix of steel and wood posts, and has electric fencing to prevent incursions by wombats and camels.

The Penong Local Dog Fence Board area will need about 60,000 wooden posts to cater for

Preparatory earthworks have been completed on 131km at Pureba and the procurement for the Penong stage (160km) is underway.

Five to eight road trains are needed to deliver the fencing materials to rebuild each new stage and Australian Wool Innovation has provided an EzyWire™ Fencing Machine to roll out. prefabricated mesh under tension.

The 1600km of new fence is funded with \$10 million from the Federal Government, \$10 million from the SA Government, and \$5 million from the livestock industry.

Expenditure to August 2021 is \$5.18 million, The project is overseen by the Dog Fence Rebuild Committee made up of the SA Dog Fence Board chair, local Dog Fence Board chairs, the private owner of the north-west section of the fence and a Livestock SA representative.

SA Dog Fence Board chair and National Wild Dog Coordination Committee chair Geoff Power said four properties alongside the new fence had now been restocked with sheep after many decades of wild dog problems.

"With our strategic ground and aerial baiting and trapping programs, we believe we are making a difference," Mr Power said.

*But it is not the time to relax as we need to stay proactive rather than be reactive once the fence is completed by strategically ground and aerial baiting, and trapping.

"Where we haven't been able to run sheep for some time, it will give landholders the choice to run sheep."

A strong focus on early maturity has allowed us to successfully mate our ewe lambs at 12 months, with long term av 87% conception rate and 100% lambs weaned.

About 950 of the top ewes are artificially inseminated each year, the majority being DNA tested for Poll status and for pedigree.

There is an emphasis on weight gain, EMD, positive C fat, and increased clean fleece weight, with sire selection using ASBV's. There is also a strong emphasis on do-ability under natural conditions. Ewes are culled heavily on dag score.

A full range of raw data and ASBV's will be available for the annual on-property auction - new date - Wednesday, September 21.

Rams are sold to satisfied customers in a wide range of environments from 150mm to 700mm rainfall. We will be displaying at the Burra Expo and SE Field Day at Keith. Private inspections are always welcome.

2008 marked a turn in our breeding at Nantoura. While a number of studs put in place a 5-year plan to phase out mulesing at Nantoura, we ceased the practice. Several alternatives to mulesing have been considered but the only viable alternative to mulesing is the same option that got us there in the first place - breeding. At Nantoura we don't attempt to coax our clients into ending mulesing but we give them the opportunity to explore all their options.

1. How long have you been involved with Merinos?

Dad had changed from breeding Merinos to crossbred in the late 90s because of the lack of returns during that time, but when I finished school in 2005 I wanted to get back into breeding our own sheep. I spent 12 months researching what I thought was a sheep that would be the easiest of care and offer the best returns per hectare and decided on the SRS type of Merino.

Jim helped to buy some rams from Keri Keri to put over them and was really excited to see the progeny, he kept following up with us over the next few years and would class our sheep every year. Eventually he talked us into keeping some rams. We have sold a few privately ever since. It wasn't until last year when we were able to purchase 50 stud ewes from the Well Gully dispersal sale, along with two rams, that I decided to register the stud.

3. What do you hope to achieve in the next few years?

Continual improvement in all aspects that make a sheep profitable. A real passion with breeding this type of sheep has been the easy care of them along with the wool quality and high lambing percentages. Because we purchased high quality sheep to start with, we have always been on the front foot with this. Since buying the ewes from Well Gully and seeing how their feed conversion is really high, I'm looking to seeing some

really quick gains in this trait, along with the gradual improvement of the other traits that makes farmers

4. What are you most looking forward to this year as a studbreeder?

Lambing time every year is really exciting to get the initial look at how the decisions you made earlier in the year with joining have turned out. We did some Al with Baderloo sire 180011 two years ago, so we have some of his offspring with the ewes at the moment. It will be great to see the results of those joinings.



5. Tell us some things about


SPRINGVALE NORTH

Staple growth of 10mms plus per month is our aim, allowing shearing frequency of client's choice. They must have correct lock structure to keep dirt out and keep fleece problems to a minimum. We like plain bodies with a loose skin – not tight. For over 20 years our stud ewe micron is under 20m. Of significance in our ongoing good-testing wools is our Blue Hills line. They have helped cement our sheep's reputation for white wool. To further enhance whiteness, Collinsville 'Emperor 321' was purchased in 2021 from our parent stud's reserves for \$35,000. He is a very big ram with a

longer stapled, crimpy wool and good carcase figures. We are confident he will take us to the next level.

The 3 rams purchased in 2020 have blossomed and will all have progeny in our 2022 sale team, along with sons of existing proven sires including 'Hunter' (Supreme – Adelaide 2017) and his sons. The Hunter line had several sale toppers in 2021, topping at \$5600. Staple length is their feature. Our 2021 sale saw value rams right through, with quality rams sold between\$1000 - \$2000.



Objective measurement is highly important, we see an animal's confirmation an extremely important starting point.

The 2021 program has produced some exciting sons from Kelvale 172115, Wirrilla Run 190091 and Pimbena 190371.

We are excited with the prospects from the joining of our own sires with several in the industry's top 5%, 10% and 20% for Yearling Weight (YWT). Eve Muscle Depth (EMD), Yearling & Adult Clean Fleece Weight (YCFW & ACFW) and Staple Length (YSL).

Our 2022 sires include Pimbena 190371, Wirrilla Run 20037 (Lachlan Merino 22706 son), 200224 & 20574 (Kelvale sons), 20120, 190091 (WP 422 son) and 190067 (WP 2032 son).

During the 2020 Classing's Classic sale a ram was purchased from Ridaway Advance, bringing new genetics into our breeding program which will aid in maintaining and improving our breeding objectives. Since purchasing this ram, progeny on the ground has proven to exceed our initial expectations within our breeding objectives, which has enabled us to have a positive outlook for future offspring and their figures.

During 2021, 12 rams were sold and 12 were kept to run in our commercial flock. Over the next year we are hoping to hear and see good results from these rams to help with making improvements going forward.

170432 for \$10,000, Collandra North 180645 for \$25,000 and the top price ram 190019 for \$13,500 at the Mernowie on-property sale

This year we have offspring from two home-bred sires, one a son of Poll Boonoke 150026 (Al), the other a son of Glenlea Park 011739 (Al).

We believe this year's sale team will be the highest quality we have ever presented.



A RESILIENT BREED PASTORAL INSIGHTS



cross the pastoral zone of South
Australia and into the western division
of New South Wales, the extensive
drought experienced over the past 5 - 6 years
has seen pastoralists and their families truly
tested, both financially and mentally.

Northern SA is tough country, where minimum rainfall is usual and those who farm here know how to manage the conditions very well. This recent and prolonged drought event has been more unusual in its severity, with the effects far more reaching than just the properties affected.

Insights provided by eight pastoralists, none of whom wanted to be highlighted here, indicate the challenges of their decisions through the course of the drought. As always, it is the unknown end date that creates the gamble. To sell or hold, invest or disperse. A lifetime of work all based on one uncontrollable variable – rain.

Stud Merino Sheepbreeder Peter Meyer explains the dilemmas faced by the pastoralist:

EARLY DAYS 2016 - 2017

In the early stages, pastoralists needed to make decisions on which stock to retain. Sheep prices were at a satisfactory level for reasonable returns, but the mental strain of selling their breeding stock was immense and depressing. In a lot of instances, as the drought continued, decisions were made to sell young ewes and older ewes and maintain core

breeding stock in the hope that the drought would end.

DRY AND COSTLY 2018 - 2021

Continued poor weather conditions lead to a number of pastoralists totally destocking, while many continued to hand fed stock with hay, grain, sheep nuts and any product that would maintain their flock's condition. Financially this has been expensive for pastoralists and lucrative for 'inside country' farmers who had feed supplies. This investment in feed continued for many pastoralists for 3 to 4 years, until rain finally fell further east in NSW and Queensland. Some agistment became available in SA too. Slowly, more agistment was accessible in other regions and their core breeding stock was sent away to graze on paddock feed of higher nutritional value.

Some pastoralists gambled by also sending rams with the ewes, while others allowed for ewes to pick up in condition before putting in the rams. It meant less on-station work, but more travel. In some cases, family members had to find accommodation away from the station, acting as shepherds for their animals.

Drought-breaking rains were not consistent across all areas and those that had mated their ewes were preparing to lamb them at the agistment property. Others moved them to a newly purchased property in more assured country, some were able to return stock to

their home place if a feeding regime allowed. During this time shearing and crutching had to be achieved. For some this was a complex operation but for most, all these objectives were achieved and reasonable lambing percentages were obtained in late 2020 / early 2021.

VARIABLE 2021- 2022

In the middle of 2021 after a small flush of green feed, dry conditions returned to a lot of pastoral areas. The fear of repeating all that financial burden, mental anguish and long hours of work was again facing the northern station owner. Through the 2nd half of 2021, rain in the form of thunderstorms, with their hit and miss pattern, began to shower the countryside, gradually filling in areas which had originally missed out or had only light falls previously.

Confidence grew as wet weather continued and most areas received good falls. Many pastoralists returned their core breeding stock to their home properties, either for convenience of shearing or other stock management. Those that required more breeding ewes were purchasing sheep from across the nation, not necessarily in big numbers but enough to give them a chance to get back to a level of normal stock rates in the near future.

Rain has continued for some in late 2021 and into the start of 2022, varying greatly across



the zone, but the confidence of the growers has risen. Normal operations have also been affected by the covid restrictions with travel, supplies and other activities.

When you look over this period you must admire the pastoral operators and their families for their resilience, persistence and ability to adapt and survive with all that has been stacked against them in the last 5 or more years. Watching prized breeding animals heading out the farm gate to slaughter for a small fraction of their true worth can be emotionally and financially crippling, for both station owner and studbreeders who lost avenues of sale due to the drought.

Rainfall allows more than the pastoral country to regenerate – it is essential for the mental health and wellbeing of stock owners and the vitality of the entire industry. Send it down, Hughie.


